PENSACOLA HAS WEST FLORIDA'S SOLID SUPPORT

DELEGATIONS FROM ALL CITIES AND TOWNS JOINED LOCAL BOOSTERS AND HAVE DECLARED INTENTIONS OF STICKING.

Pensacola's delegation to Tallahassee was not forgotten by the people who could not go, and all during the day telegrams came pouring from city, county and districts, telling of the spirit back of the delegation.

West Florida is solidly behind Pensacola in her claims for the centennial. Delegations from all the cities and towns in the western part of the state attended the meeting yesterday, some coming by special train, some on regular trains and many by automobile.

The spirit displayed by the merchants and professional men of the city and of West Florida, and by the citizens of every walk in life, has given the centennial committee unlimited pep and nerve. The workers declare that Pensacola cannot lose; that they have substantial reasons strong enough to swing the commission for this city, and that they have the backing of all West Florida.

Tallahasseeans were for Pensacola strong. They wore Pensacola badges, ribbons and buttons, and very few of them would accept badges from the Jacksonville boosters. The young women from the state college, representing the West Florida contingent, were active boosters for Pensacola, and they have all been invited to come over in 1922, when the celebration is in full swing.

Johnny Frenkel made himself strong with the college girls when he sang for them at a supper given to about twenty of the Pensacola delegation at the college. The girls who joined the Pensacola contingent at the senate chamber were guests of the Pensacola delegates at dinner following the meeting.
