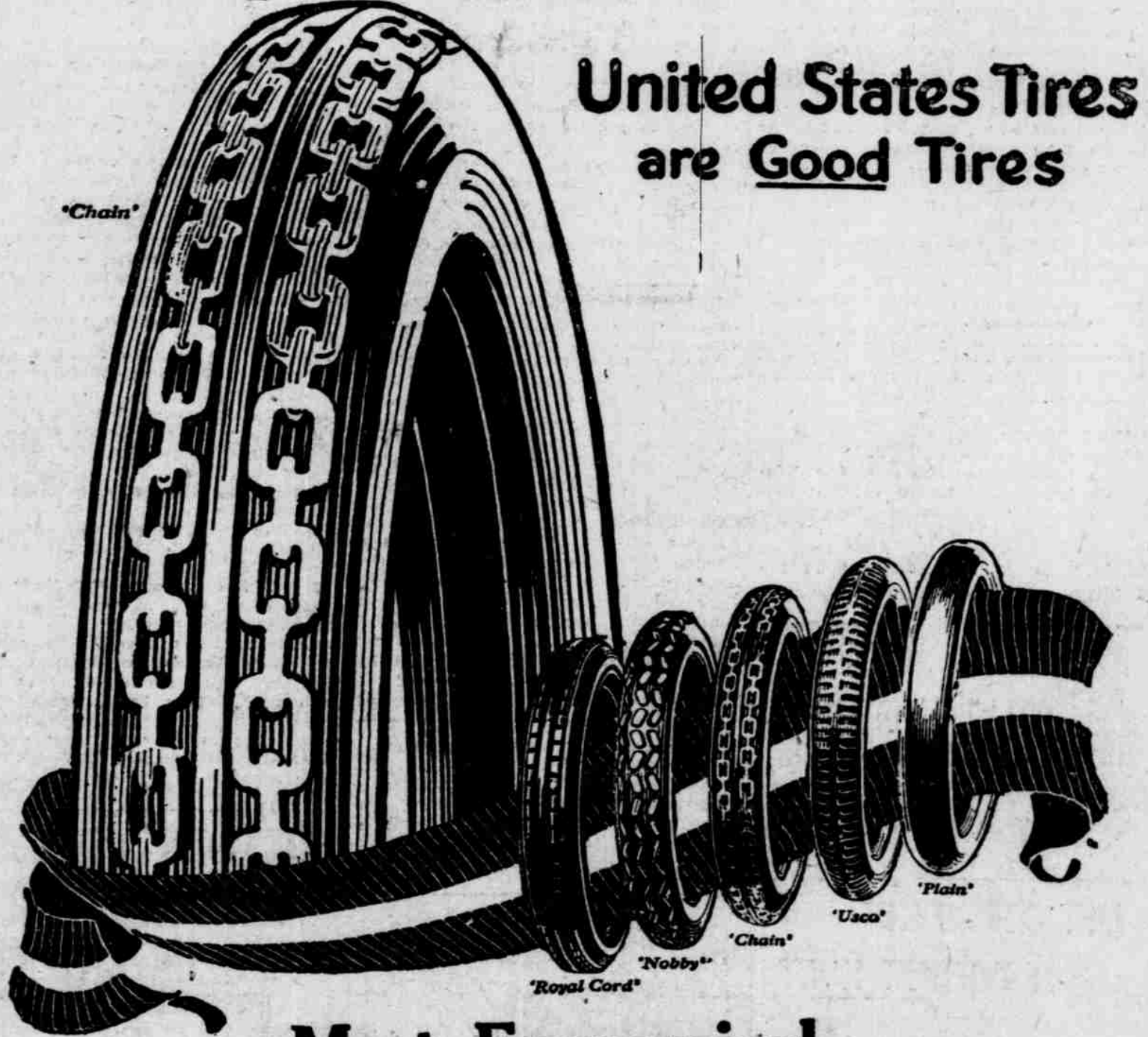

PASTIME
One of the dramatic treats of the
season will be offered at the Pastime
theatre on Oct. 23, 24, 25, when Nat
S. Jerome, the noted comedian and
character actor will appear in a new
one act comedy entitled "Our Chil-
dren," written and staged by that un-

As an exponent of a certain type of

bit of character acting. Emmet De-
voy has provided him with a role that
fits like a glove.
"Our Children" is a comedy drama
with comedy predominating. It is the
story of the fusion of wills and ideas.
The beach at Atlantic City, like the
sands of most summer resorts, is a
play ground and out-door play is usu-
ally athletic. This is why Nellie and
Ernest Veronica have selected the
beach at Atlantic City as the scene
gymnastic routine. They are among
the fastest of comedy ground tumblers
and offer some excellent somersault-
ing. The introduction of a rolling
chair enables them to offer many new
feats in a novel manner.
Gertrude Van Dyck is known as
"The Love Girl." This title should
not be taken as meaning sentimental.
"tommy-rot." It applies to the love
of mankind and to the love of all
things beautiful, and more to the
lover of her work.
Miss Van Dyck is a singing com-
edienne. She presents in story and
song a creation of her brother's, Vin-
cent Van Dyck, called "Life's Greatest
Question." It sounds like a problem
play, but it is not. "The Great Ques-

provide wholesome entertainment and

joyed more popularity than Marion and
Victoria Murray. They established
themselves in the amusement world
with the stability of Gibraltar, and
just as a tourist looks forward to some
time seeing the Rock of Gibraltar, so
does the public look forward to the
engagement of the Murray Sisters.
For their re-association they have
had Frances Nordstrom supply their
songs and patter. Few writers are
more capable to do this than "Gas"
