A Democratic Rally.
Washington, Dec. 8.—To consider plans for insuring party success in 1912, prominent Democrats from many States are gathering in Washington to-day to take part in a session of the National Democratic League.

Chairman William C. Liller declares that a meeting has not been held in the interest of Bryan or any other possible candidate. He explained that it is the purpose of the league to maintain intact the organization now existing and to strengthen the league so as to eliminate the work of reorganization at the beginning of each campaign.

"The Democratic party, while disappointed over the result of the election, has much cause for elation," said Col. Liller. "The party now united more thoroughly than any time since 1892. Its recent defeat has not dampened the enthusiasm of its members, but awakened them to the necessity of proper organization and a return to true and fundamental Democratic principles. Reorganization of clubs will be held everywhere from now on." Leading Democratic clubs all over the country have sent representatives to the rally. The sessions will occupy tomorrow and Thursday.

Chief Harris of the Tampa fire department has compiled figures for the Southeastern Tariff Association which shows that Tampa's fire losses during the last ten years have aggregated \$1,383,297.71.

The Florida Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, meets in Miami December 16, and will be presided over by Bishop Chas. B. Galloway, one of the grandest men in the South.

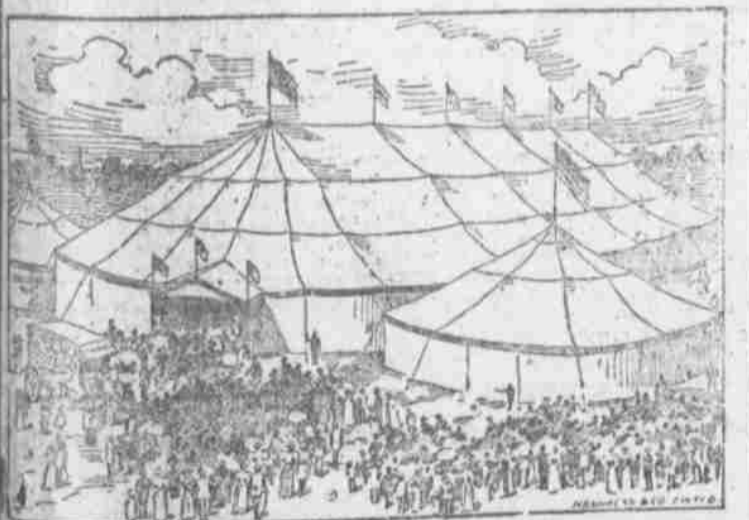

The Only Way to Cure Pork.
First salt pork with plain salt by rubbing on and spreading out, say 12 hours, then apply to hams and shoulders as follows: Salt 10 lbs., brown sugar 2 lbs., salt petre 2 ounces, red pepper 1 ounce—to 100 lbs. of pork; rub and apply freely. Sides result. If killing is done while weather is cool, say frosty, meat may not be stored for four to five days after butchering, but if warm it should be stored within 12 hours. Do not cut off chin bone, as this ruins the ham, and in storage they cure as well with chin left on.
Time to be stored: Thirty days is sufficient. When taken from storage wash in warm water, wipe dry, sew up in canvas or homespun hang up and smoke every third day for two weeks. Use green hickory wood for smoking.
