## Killing at Parrot's Tie Camp.

Last Friday afternoon at Parrott's tie camp located near Howell, about four miles south of town, Robert Scott was shot and killed by Alfred Hutchinson, both negroes.

Hutchinson was woodsman for his employer and in the course of his duties became involved in a dispute with the negro Scott concerning the number of ties which said Scott had cut out; Scott claiming some twenty or more ties in excess of the number which Hutchinson had given him credit for. Angry words were exchanged but no blows, and finally, it is said, Hutchinson went off and coming back with his gun fired a load into the body of Scott inflicting a wound from which he died Saturday afternoon.

Dr. Yates performed an autopsy upon the body Saturday and located the bullet which caused death.

Immediately after the shooting Hutchinson disappeared and it was thought that he had made good his escape, but Sheriff Stanton apprehended him late Saturday afternoon and has him now securely locked up in jail.
