Port Orange, the machine stuck in
the sand, and efforts to extricate it
were altogether futile. The several
passengers, seeing that the tide was
rapidly rising, got out and made their
way back to the city. Watts stayed
with the car all night, during which
time it sank nearly two feet in the
sand, and at one time was entirely
covered by sea water.
