The Brooklynites took the big end of the tally, but the somewhat shuffled up Mackmen made it more than interesting for the gentlemen from beyond the suspension bridge.

Jack Barry, Rube Oldring, Jimmie Walsh and Amos Strunk were among the missing, along with Joe Bush and a couple of young pitchers, having returned to Jacksonville on Sunday evening.

This left Ira Thomas with the job on his hands of putting together a team composed of sundry recruit pitchers, the remnants of the infield, etc. The result resembled an Irish stew, but somehow the bunch managed to pull through nine innings in fairly good fashion.

Ira Thomas decorated the initial sack, while Hamilton did the hurling, the outfield being composed of three slab artists, who, by the way, turned out to be gardeners of sorts. Each of them pulled off a grandstand catch in succession, in two instances robbing the Superba batsmen of what looked to be sure hits.

Davies made the first one handed stab off Cutshaw in the opening round and was immediately followed by Pennock, who took Getz' high foul away over by the automobile row. Voltz in right field contributed his specialty in the second session when he grabbed Zimmerman's smash with one horny mitt.

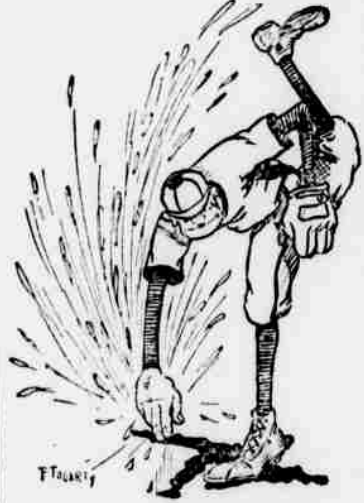
