## AUSTRIA REFUSES ITALY'S TERMS

ROME, May 7.—Dispatches from the frontier state that Austria has rejected terms proposed as the price of Italy's neutrality, and the indications are war will immediately follow.

It is reported that martial law has already been declared in the Italian provinces of Austria, and that Italians in large numbers are crossing the international border into Italy.

## MAY, ABOUT TO ENTER PREPARING NOTE OF EXPLANATION TO WORLD

MAY 7.—WITH ITALY NEARER WAR THAN AT ANY TIME SINCE EUROPEAN HOSTILITIES COMMENCED LAST AUGUST, THE GOVERNMENT TODAY TO CONSIDER A COMMUNICATION STATING ITS OFFICIAL ATTITUDE.  
IT IS REPORTED THAT THE FOREIGN OFFICE HAS BEGUN THE DRAFTING OF A NOTE TO THE POWERS JUSTIFYING ITALY'S ENTRANCE INTO THE WAR ON THE SIDE OF THE ALLIES. IT IS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE GOVERNMENT WILL POSTPONE THE OPENING OF PARLIAMENT UNTIL AFTER THE END OF THE MONTH.  
A DECREE JUST PUBLISHED EMPOWERS THE GOVERNMENT TO SUSPEND TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH SERVICES IN THE KINGDOM IN CASE OF EXTRAORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES.

## RUSSIAN TROOPS START MOVE TO PREVENT SENDING OF GERMAN REINFORCEMENTS

BRNO, MAY 7.—WITH A GREAT BATTLE RAGING BETWEEN THE RUSSIAN TROOPS AND THE VISTULA RIVER, WHERE THE GERMAN TROOPS ARE POSITIONED STRONGLY FORTIFIED, THE GERMAN TROOPS ASSUMED THE OFFENSIVE AT A NUMBER OF POINTS IN THE DISTRICT OF BRNO, HOPING TO PREVENT THE SENDING OF RUSSIAN REINFORCEMENTS INTO WESTERN GALICIA. ANOTHER BATTLE IS BEING FIGHTED SOUTH OF JASLO.  
ANOTHER GERMAN ARMY IS PREPARING TO ATTACK THE RUSSIAN POSITIONS AT TARNOW.  
THOUSAND TEUTONS HAVE FALLEN IN THE MIGHTY BATTLE OF BRNO WHICH BEGAN MAY 1ST.

## TORNADO DESTROYS 10 HOMES IN MISSISSIPPI; OTHERS IN TENNESSEE

OSHALES, MISS., MAY 7.—TEN PERSONS ARE REPORTED TO BE INJURED, WITH PROPERTY DAMAGE ESTIMATED AT \$1,000,000 DOLLARS, AS THE RESULT OF A TORNADO WHICH STRUCK THIS SECTION THIS MORNING. THE VICTIMS WERE TENANTS ON PLANTATIONS AND MOST OF THEM WERE NEGROES.  
THE MOST DEVASTATING OF THE STORM'S VIOLENCE WAS IN THE VICINITY OF OSHALES, WHERE THE GREATER PART OF THE DAMAGE WAS DONE. HUNDREDS OF ACRES OF FARM LANDS ARE FLOODED, AND NUMEROUS HORSES, MULES AND CATTLE HAVE BEEN DROWNED.

CLAY, TENN., MAY 7.—MRS. SARAH HAYS WAS KILLED, HER SON, HAY, FATALLY INJURED AND HIS WIFE BADLY HURT, BY A TORNADO WHICH BLOWN DOWN, MANY ORCHARDS UPROOTED AND HOUSES WERE UNROOFED BY A TORNADO WHICH PARADED THROUGH THIS SECTION OF TENNESSEE LAST NIGHT.  
AT HOPKINSVILLE, KY., WERE UNROOFED.

## TREMENDOUS RAINFALL IN ATLANTA

ATLANTA, MAY 7.—TWO INCHES OF RAIN FELL IN AN HOUR AND FIVE MINUTES THIS MORNING, BREAKING A LONG DROUGHT. W. L. TRUSSELL, LABORER WORKING IN A SEWER, WAS DROWNED BY A SUDDEN DELUGE. THIS WAS THE HEAVIEST RAINFALL IN ATLANTA SINCE THE WEATHER BUREAU WAS ESTABLISHED.

GADSDEN, MAY 7.—BETWEEN MIDNIGHT LAST NIGHT AND NINE O'CLOCK THIS MORNING FIVE INCHES OF RAIN FELL HERE, BREAKING A SIX WEEKS' DROUGHT.

## CERTAIN CHINA-JAPAN WAR WILL BE AVERTED, BELIEF IN CITY OF TOKIO

TOKIO, MAY 7.—AUTHENTIC ASSURANCES HAVE BEEN RECEIVED TODAY THAT WAR BETWEEN CHINA AND JAPAN HAS BEEN AVERTED. CHINA, IT IS RELIABLY REPORTED, HAS DEFINITELY DECIDED TO GRANT THE JAPANESE DEMANDS.

TIEN TSIN, MAY 7.—THE JAPANESE MINISTER TO CHINA HAS PREPARED TO LEAVE PEKIN.

JAPANESE TROOPS ARE MOVING TOWARD THE MANCHURIAN RAILWAY, WHICH CONNECTS PEKIN WITH THE TRANS-SIBERIAN SYSTEM IN RUSSIA. A LARGE ARMY HAS BEEN CONCENTRATED IN MONGOLIA, WHICH PROVINCE IT IS SAID WILL CO-OPERATE WITH JAPAN IF WAR IS DECLARED. IT IS REPORTED THAT CHINESE AND JAPANESE TROOPS HAVE ALREADY CLASHED AT TSINAN.

## CONSTANTINOPLE BOMBARDED

ATHENS, MAY 7.—THREE RUSSIAN AIRMEN BOMBARDED CONSTANTINOPLE TODAY AND IT IS BELIEVED THAT CONSIDERABLE DAMAGE WAS DONE BY EXPLODING SHELLS. RUSSIAN SHELLS FELL WITHIN TEN MILES OF CONSTANTINOPLE DURING BOMBARDMENT OF THE BOSPHORUS BY THE BLACK SEA SQUADRON.

## YPRES BATTLE TURNED INTO ARTILLERY DUEL

PARIS, MAY 7 (Official).—THE GREAT BATTLE WHICH HAD BEEN RAGING ALONG THE YPRES FRONT HAS RESOLVED ITSELF INTO AN ARTILLERY DUEL. ANOTHER VIOLENT ARTILLERY BATTLE IS RAGING ABOUT THE VAUQUOIS FRONT. THE ENEMY ATTEMPTED TO TAKE BY STORM FRENCH POSITIONS NEAR BAGATELLE, IN THE ARGONNE, LAST NIGHT, BUT THE ATTACKS BROKE DOWN, SO FIERCE WAS THE FRENCH RESISTANCE.

## AVIATOR CRIPPLES TURKISH ARMY

LONDON, MAY 7.—THE TURKISH LINE OF COMMUNICATION BETWEEN SMYRNA AND THE DARDANELLES WAS CUT TODAY BY THE DESTRUCTION OF A BRIDGE BY A BRITISH AVIATOR. THE ALLIES HAVE CAPTURED THE HEIGHTS COMMANDING SOUAIN FORT ON THE GALLIPOLI PENINSULA.

## CUNARD LINER SAID TO HAVE BEEN TORPEDOED OFF SO. COAST IRELAND; HAD 1200 PASSENGERS

LONDON, MAY 7.—THE CUNARD LINER LUSITANIA, WHICH SAILED FROM NEW YORK LAST SATURDAY AFTER MANY OF THE PASSENGERS HAD BEEN WARNED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS NOT TO MAKE THE TRIP, IS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN TORPEDOED AND SUNK TODAY OFF THE COAST OF IRELAND.

NEW YORK, MAY 7.—THE CUNARD STEAMSHIP COMPANY TODAY RECEIVED AN UNCONFIRMED REPORT FROM ITS LIVERPOOL AGENTS THAT THE LINER LUSITANIA HAD BEEN TORPEDOED BY A GERMAN SUBMARINE.

LONDON, MAY 7.—LLOYD'S REPORTS THE CUNARD LINER LUSITANIA SUNK OFF KINSALE. NO DETAILS WERE GIVEN.

LONDON, MAY 7.—A LATER DISPATCH SAYS THE LUSITANIA IS REPORTED BEACHED OFF KINSALE, AND THAT THE PASSENGERS AND CREW ARE BELIEVED TO BE SAFE, ACCORDING TO LLOYD'S. KINSALE IS ABOUT 40 MILES SOUTHWEST OF QUEENSTOWN, IRELAND. THE LUSITANIA CARRIED ABOUT 1,200 PEOPLE BESIDES THE CREW.

LONDON, MAY 7, 2:55 P. M.—IT IS REPORTED THAT THE LUSITANIA WAS FLYING THE AMERICAN FLAG WHEN TORPEDOED. A LARGE STEAMSHIP ARRIVED SOON AFTER THE ATTACK WAS MADE, AND RENDERED ASSISTANCE. TUGS, PATROLS, AND OTHER BOATS TOOK THE LIFEBOATS IN TOW. THE WEATHER WAS CLEAR.

ONE REPORT SAYS THE TORPEDOING TOOK PLACE AT 2:00 O'CLOCK THIS MORNING, AND THAT THE VESSEL REMAINED AFLOAT UNTIL TWO O'CLOCK THIS AFTERNOON, ALLOWING THE PASSENGERS TWELVE HOURS IN WHICH TO DISEMBARK. TWENTY BOATS ARE SAID TO HAVE LEFT THE BIG LINER WITH PASSENGERS AND SEAMEN.

NEW YORK, MAY 7, 3:20 P. M.—THE AMERICAN AMBASSADOR TO LONDON CABLED THIS AFTERNOON CONFIRMATION OF THE TORPEDOING OF THE LUSITANIA, STATING THAT SHE SANK WITHIN HALF AN HOUR. HE HAD NO REPORT CONCERNING THE FATE OF THE PASSENGERS.

CUNARD OFFICIALS DECLARE THE LINER WAS SUNK WITHOUT WARNING. THE LIVERPOOL AGENT OF THE COMPANY SAID THAT IF ANY PASSENGERS WERE SAVED, AS IT IS HOPED THERE WERE, THEY WOULD BE LANDED ON THE IRISH COAST AND BROUGHT TO LIVERPOOL.

ONE MORE FISHING BOAT LOST.

LONDON, May 7.—A German submarine torpedoed and sank the trawler Don in the North Sea, Thursday.
