BILL PROVIDING A TRANS-FLORIDA CANAL APPROVED

Washington, Jan. 29—Survey under direction of the secretary of war for a canal from Cumberland sound on the Atlantic seaboard to the mouth of the Mississippi river would be authorized under a bill introduced by Representative Clark, Democrat, Florida, and reported favorable today by the house committee on railroads and canals. An appropriation of 50,000 would be made for this purpose.

The project contemplates the building of a sea level canal from the Atlantic across Georgia and Florida to St. George's sound on the Gulf of Mexico, southwest of Tallahassee, Fla. From St. George's sound the existing natural inland waterway would be opened up along the northern edge of the Gulf of Mexico westward past Mobile bay and through lakes Borgne and Pontchartrain to the Mississippi river at New Orleans.

The proposed canal would be about 265 miles in length, but by use of existing navigable waters, it was estimated that not more than 150 miles would have to be excavated. Such a waterway, it was estimated would save 497 miles between New Orleans and New York and 412 miles from New Orleans to Liverpool.

Under the provisions of the bill the secretary of war would be required to report to congress on the cost of constructing a sea level ship canal of such dimensions as to accommodate the largest sea going vessels, and also a lock canal of the same size, and a barge canal of such dimensions as to accommodate the largest barges being used for the carriage of freight on any waters of the United States.
