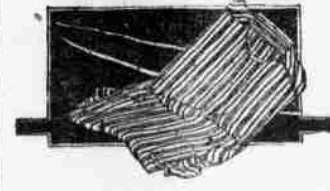


SOCIAL NOTES AND PERSONAL GOSSIP

BOBBY HARRON'S BROTHER PLAYS IN PICKFORD FILM

One of the principal players in Mary Pickford's latest United Artists' production, "Through the Back Door," is John Harron, brother of the late Robert Harron who died in New York recently as the result of an accidental gun-shot wound. The picture will be presented at the Grand today for the last time. Johnnie Harrison is playing the part of Billy Boy in "Through the Back Door," around which role is built the love interest in the story. As the cousin of a wealthy family summering on Long Island, Billy Boy meets Mary Pickford, in the character of Jeanne, and his sympathy and help do much to alleviate the trials and tribulations that befall the little heroine when she accepted a position as domestic in her own mother's home. There is a striking resemblance between Johnnie Harron and his late brother, and he gives to the character of Billy Boy that same appealing sympathy that was always the outstanding feature of Robert Harron's work. In fact, those who see John in this picture will gain the impression that much of the glory enshrining Robert Harron's name is now reflecting in the work of his younger brother. Johnnie Harron is eighteen years of age. He began his career as a photo-player in his knee-trouser days at the Griffith Studio in Hollywood. Whenever D. W. Griffith needed a boy for a part in any production, Robert Harron would always speak up and say, "Let Johnnie do it." And Johnnie did, with the result that he received his training from the master of all screen technicians.
