The Southfield will probably be opened this year under the same management as during the past two seasons. This house is elegantly furnished and its table is the best. The prices rule a little higher than at the other hotels. It will accommodate about the same number as Crescent Inn.

The Burton House is a well-kept, clean and comfortable boarding house with accommodations for 10 to 15 people, and the prices are moderate. The Misses Turner are in charge.
