#### FEDERAL OFFICE ASPIRANTS

With the election of Woodrow Wilson to the presidency comes the certainty of changes in the higher official positions, which have been held by influential members of the Republican party for the past sixteen years. These offices are not only responsible and honorable, but are sufficiently remunerative as to make them attractive to the average citizen. Hence there need be little or no surprise at the rush of aspirants to the Democratic "pie-counter."

The first position that will be declared vacant is Collector of Internal Revenue at the port of Jacksonville. This is now held by Joe Lee, the colored leader of the State g. o. p. Doubtless there will be a small army of applicants for this berth, which is regarded as about the most desirable in all Florida. Hon. Hayes Lewis, the Jackson county politician, who has long labored in the ranks of progressive Democracy, and who is one of the original Wilson men, is a candidate, and in his efforts to land this big appointment he will have the cordial endorsement and enthusiastic support of the most powerful political influences of the State.

Another position of preferment soon to be vacated is that of Register of the Land Office at Gainesville, now held by Hon. Henry S. Chubb, who for years past has had the official party patronage in his control. Hon. Perry M. Colson hopes to succeed Mr. Chubb. Mr. Colson is not only the most genial of men, but is admirably qualified to fill the position he seeks. He has had ample experience in the land office, and his wide knowledge of property throughout the State would stand him in good stead in the conduct of the office. He has the support of many leading Democrats, so his prospects for landing the appointment are very good indeed.

For the high position of United States district attorney for the Northern district of Florida Hon. Worth W. Trammell is a candidate. Mr. Trammell is one of the most able young Democrats of the South. He has served as legislator, as assistant attorney-general, and he is now assistant district attorney. His record is clean throughout, and is of such exalted character as to have ever been marked by faithful service, brilliantly and satisfactorily performed. He is a brother of Hon. Park M. Trammell, Florida's next governor. Here's trusting that Worth Trammell will secure the office he seeks and so well merits.

Hon. A. J. Angle is an aspirant for the position of collector of customs for the port of Tampa. Mr. Angle is a recognized leader of the "progressive Democracy" in Florida. In the recent campaign he was a big factor, being president of the first Woodrow Wilson Club in Florida. He was also chairman of the National Finance Committee for Florida, and gave freely of his time and means for the Wilson contest. As a legislator he was ever found on the side of the people. His work for the party and the State entitles him to recognition at the hands of the coming administration, and his friends trust to see him hold the lucrative office he is seeking.—Palatka Herald.
