

# CONTRACT FOR BIG BUILDING TO BE AWARDED

COUNTY BOARD OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION WILL OPEN BIDS MONDAY NIGHT FOR TWELVE ROOM SCHOOL HOUSE FOR COLORED CHILDREN ON WEST JACKSON STREET.

When the Escambia county board of public instruction meets Monday night, the most important action of that board will be the opening of bids and awarding of the contract for the erection of a commodious school building to be erected on West Jackson street and to be occupied by the colored school children of that district. The plans call for a twelve room structure, modern in every respect.
