

J. Hinde, Driver Of Car, Held In County Jail; May Face Grand Jury

A fifty-one-year-old wom an was killed instantly late last night when she was struck by an automobile at First Street and Staples Avenue.

The victim, who was pronounced dead on arrival at Monroe General Hospital. was Mrs. Nora Wallace of 1910 Harris Avenue. She was struck down by a speeding automobile as she walked south on First street at about 10:30 p.m.

The driver of the automo bile that struck her, Jerry Hinde, 18 of 2207 Flagler Avenue, is being held in the Monroe County jail under a \$5000 bond for investigation awaiting the result of a Coroner's inquest into the death of the woman.

According to witnesses to the fatal accident, young Hinde was travelling south on First street when he pulled out into the opposite when he pulsed out into the opposite line of traffic to pass a car operated by Joseph Crusoe of 902 Florida Street when he struck Mrs. Wallace with a terrific impact that carried or threw her some 70 feet. The victim was walking in the street facing oncoming traffic. There is no sidewalk in that area. According to skid marks at the scene, the death car travelled nearly 125 feet before Hinde could being it to a common to the scene.

Police Officer Edward Ramirez, who conducted the investigation at the scene, placed Hinde under arrest for investigation and this morning, he was taken to the Monroe County Jail to await the findings of a coroner's jury which was convened by Coroner Roy Hamlin to view the body and investigate at the scene this morning. A formal inquest is expected to be held on Tuesday, according to Hamlin, after which Hinde may face possible Grand Jury action.
