## Lt. Comdr. Morin Succeeds Commander Denegre As CO Of USS Clamagore Today

**New CO Owns Home At 2807 Staples Avenue**

Lt. Comdr. George F. Morin, USN, succeeded Comdr. Thomas B. Denegre, Jr., USN, as commanding officer of the USS Clamagore in ceremonies held aboard the submarine this morning at 9 o'clock.

Comdr. Denegre, skipper of the Clamagore since January 1950 will report to Washington, D. C. for duty under the Chief of Naval operations.

Lt. Comdr. Morin, submarine school graduate in 1942, was former executive officer of the USS Coral stationed here. He also served aboard the submarines R-20, and Creville. He and his wife the former Hope E. Smith, live at 2807 Staples Avenue, in a home they own.

Senior officer at this morning's change of command ceremony was Capt. Charles H. Andrews, commander squadron four, who recently relieved Capt. J. W. Davis. Also participating in the ceremony was Division Commander, Comdr. Albert L. Becker.

In resplendent whites Comdr. Denegre said farewell to the officers and men of the Clamagore, which has a complement of 81. He shook hands with all aboard.

Lt. Comdr. Morin accepted the command of ship while the crew stood at attention in the hot August sun.

Comdr. Denegre was presented with a pipe holder and pipe with a silver engraved plaque by the Clamagore.

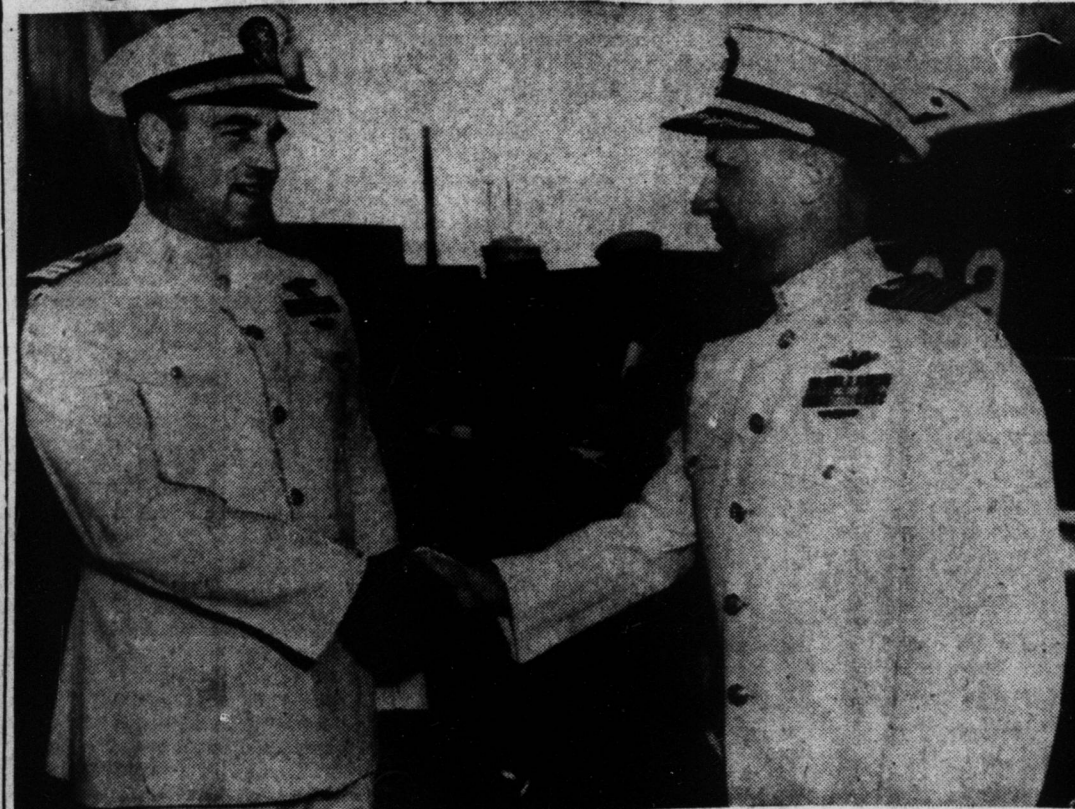
Standing on the pier were wives and children of the participating officers who watched their men proudly.

The lot of the press was made easier by Lt. (j.g.) F. T. Watkins, Clamagore PIO who had biographies, of ship and commanding officers on hand. The Clamagore, it was learned, is named for the fish more popularly known as parrot fish.

Launched in 1945, the Clamagore attained the highest standards of battle efficiency in Squadron Four while commanded by Comdr. Denegre and in 1949 while in charge of Comdr. Walter L. Small. Commendations were given to all hands on board.

The new commander was born in Lee, Massachusetts, attended Lee High School and Bates College, Lewiston, Maine. He has one child, Mark, aged six. His mother Mrs. (Continued on Page Ten)

## HURRICANE FELT AT SAVANNAH

**Dangerous Atlantic Hurricane Approaches Georgia, South Carolina**

MIAMI (AP)—Immediate emergency precautions were ordered today on the Georgia and South Carolina Coasts for a dangerous Atlantic hurricane approaching the shore line.

The edge of the vicious tropical twister already was being felt. Rain was falling in Savannah, Ga., and the barometer dropping.

Thousands of Labor Day weekenders were fleeing Georgia beaches and island resorts.

Hurricane warnings fluttered along the 250-mile stretch of Atlantic coastline between Fernandina, Fla., and Georgetown, S. C.

The 11 a.m. EST advisory located this season's first hurricane about 130 miles southeast of Brunswick, Ga. The center was near Latitude 30.0 north and Longitude 80.0 west. (Continued on Page Ten)

## "Crack Down" Launched On B-Girls Here

**Sheriff's Department Says Heat Is On Them In Miami And Some Are Coming Down Here**

The Monroe County Sheriff's department launched a crack down on "women doing what they do on the street late at night," by arresting Irene McMahon, 24, of Miami at 1:10 this morning.

Deputy Serge Hernandez arrested the woman on a charge of public drunkenness. She is in Monroe county jail will have a preliminary hearing before Peace Justice Ira Albury.

The woman, according to Hernandez, was drunk on Duval Street near Sloppy Joe's. She was barefoot, in black shorts, split up the back, and a man's shirt tied around her midriff, he said.

"She was a mess, that's all," said Hernandez.

When he tried to arrest her, an 18 year old sailor, Francis Lake, accompanying her "tried to interfere" with him, said Hernandez. He arrested the sailor on that charge.

## Mrs. Nora Wallace Killed By Car On First St. Last Night

### J. Hinde, Driver Of Car, Held In County Jail; May Face Grand Jury

A fifty-one-year-old woman was killed instantly late last night when she was struck by an automobile at First Street and Staples Avenue.

The victim, who was pronounced dead on arrival at Monroe General Hospital, was Mrs. Nora Wallace of 1910 Harris Avenue. She was struck down by a speeding automobile as she walked south on First street at about 10:30 p.m.

The driver of the automobile that struck her, Jerry Hinde, 18, of 2207 Flagler Avenue, is being held in the Monroe County jail under a \$5000 bond for investigation awaiting the result of a Coroner's inquest into the death of the woman.

According to witnesses to the fatal accident, young Hinde was travelling south on First street when he pulled out into the opposite line of traffic to pass a car operated by Joseph Crusoe of 302 Florida Street when he struck Mrs. Wallace with a terrific impact that carried or threw her some 70 feet. The victim was walking in the street facing oncoming traffic. There is no sidewalk in that area. According to skid marks at the scene, the death car travelled nearly 125 feet before Hinde could bring it to a stop.

The crash victim was taken to the Monroe General Hospital by ambulance where she was pronounced dead on arrival by physicians. Suffering from a fractured skull, a broken neck, compound fractures of both legs and internal injuries, Mrs. Wallace is thought to have died at the moment of impact.

Police Officer Edward Ramirez, who conducted the investigation at the scene, placed Hinde under arrest for investigation and this morning, he was taken to the Monroe County Jail to await the findings of a coroner's jury which was convened by Coroner Roy Hamlin to view the body and investigate at the scene this morning. A formal inquest is expected to be held on Tuesday, according to Hamlin, after which Hinde may face possible Grand Jury action.

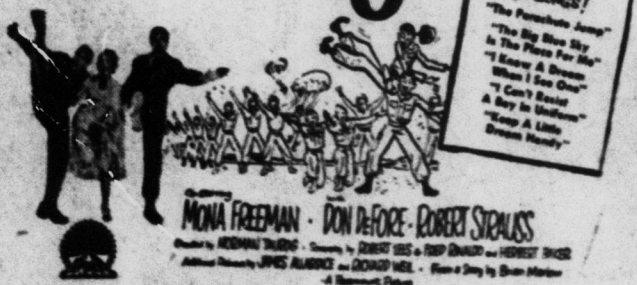
