

SPORTING NOTES

In his recent bout with Joe Lynch Charlie Ledoux, the French bantamweight champion, made a better impression on the fans than in any of his previous contests in this side.

A Cincinnati club has matched "Wild Burt" Kenny, the New York heavyweight, and Harry Greb of Pittsburgh for a 10-round contest to be brought off on the night of August 14.

Officials of the Inland Lakes Yachting Association report a promising outlook for the success of the association's annual regatta, which is to be held at Oshkosh the week of August 16.

Louis Bogash, the Bridgeport fighter, will meet the most formidable opponent he has yet faced when he hooks up Champion Jack Britton. The two are matched for a 12-round bout at Bridgeport on the night of August 23.

James P. Fox, who is accompanying the American oarsmen to Antwerp as the official representative of the National Association of Amateur Oarsmen, has been identified with amateur rowing in New England for over 30 years and has directed many big regattas.

Heavyweights will figure in the feature event of the next show of the Armory A. A. of Jersey City, Aug. 16. The big fellows who will

furnish the entertainment are Frank Moran, the Pittsburgh heavy, and Al Reich, the New York battler. It will be Reich's first appearance in the ring for several months.

Trapshooters from all of the States in the Union and four of the Provinces of Canada will take part in the Grand American Handicap tournament, which will be held in Cleveland Aug. 23-28. Officials of the American Trapshooting Association expect the tournament to be the biggest affair of its kind in recent years.
