Income Tax Returns Must Be Made This Month

All persons having net incomes of \$3,000.00 or more must make return of schedule showing such income on or before March 1, next.

In Florida all returns must be made to the collector of internal revenue, Jacksonville, Fla., and they should be made promptly to avoid the severe penalty that attaches to failure to make return.

The collector has already sent out a great many blanks to persons whose incomes are believed to be taxable under the new income tax law but failure to receive such blank does not relieve anyone who is subject to the tax from his responsibility to make the return.

If your net income is \$3,000.00 or more you should make your return at once. If you have failed to receive a blank just write the collector for one and he will furnish it. But under no circumstances must you fail to make return on or before March 1.

The Caucius is a very powerful boat and without her aid the Tarpon would probably have remained aground until help could have gotten from Pensacola.
