MEXICAN DELEGATES REACH WASHINGTON

They Are Guests at a Dinner at the Spanish Embassy, Together With South American Mediators, the United States Commissioners and Others—Mexicans Promise Report on Soldier Parks.

BY ASSOCIATED PRESS. Washington, May 16.—The Mexican delegates to the Niagara Falls peace conference arrived here late today.

Representations of the Huerta government regarding Private Parks, the American soldier today resulted in a promise from the Mexican foreign minister of an immediate investigation.

Consul Canada, of Vera Cruz, reported the Constitutionalists are in possession of Tuxpam and they are also reported in possession of Monclova.

The Mexican delegates leave for New York tomorrow, it was learned late tonight.

PRESIDENT WILL ORDER FEDERAL TROOPS MOVED FROM COLORADO

WILL BE USED BY VESSELS OF NAVY

Fuel is to be Delivered at Galveston, and it is Understood Schooners Will be Chartered for the Purpose of Handling it Between Pensacola and the Texas Port.

Proposals for supplying the navy department with 10,000 or more tons of Alabama coal each month were opened in New Orleans yesterday, with a number of the big mining corporations submitting bids on the grade of coal called for, among them being the Tennessee Coal, Iron & Railway Company.

The coal is to be delivered at Galveston and for this reason it is believed that Pensacola will get the business. Several years ago the coal trade between Pensacola and Galveston was of big volume, but it was lost to a private concern in New Orleans.

Regarding the big contract the Birmingham News of yesterday contained the following: "Looking to submitting bids for a big supply of coal to the United States government through the port of Galveston, Texas, for use during the absence of the fleet in Mexican waters, representatives of coal mining companies of the Birmingham district are now in New Orleans.
