

PENSACOLA IN LEAD IN VALUE OF SHIPMENTS

EXPORTS DURING PAST MONTH MORE THAN DOUBLED THOSE OF ANY OTHER FLORIDA PORT.

Pensacola leads all Florida ports by more than double the valuation in exports during the past month, according to figures compiled in the office of Collector Cooper Griggs at Jacksonville. Shipments from this port during the month were valued at \$1,094,862, while the values of shipments from all other Florida ports combined reached only \$1,677,000. The next highest port to Pensacola is Tampa with a valuation of \$481,000, and the total value of all exports from Florida reached \$2,771,579. The principal commodity shipped was lumber and timber, most of which went out from Pensacola and aggregated 42,500,000 superficial feet. In imports, Tampa leads with a valuation of \$229,101, on which duty amounting to \$150,895 was collected. Key West is second, Jacksonville third and Pensacola fourth. The total valuation of all imports reached \$1,044,000, on which duties amounting to \$870 was collected.
