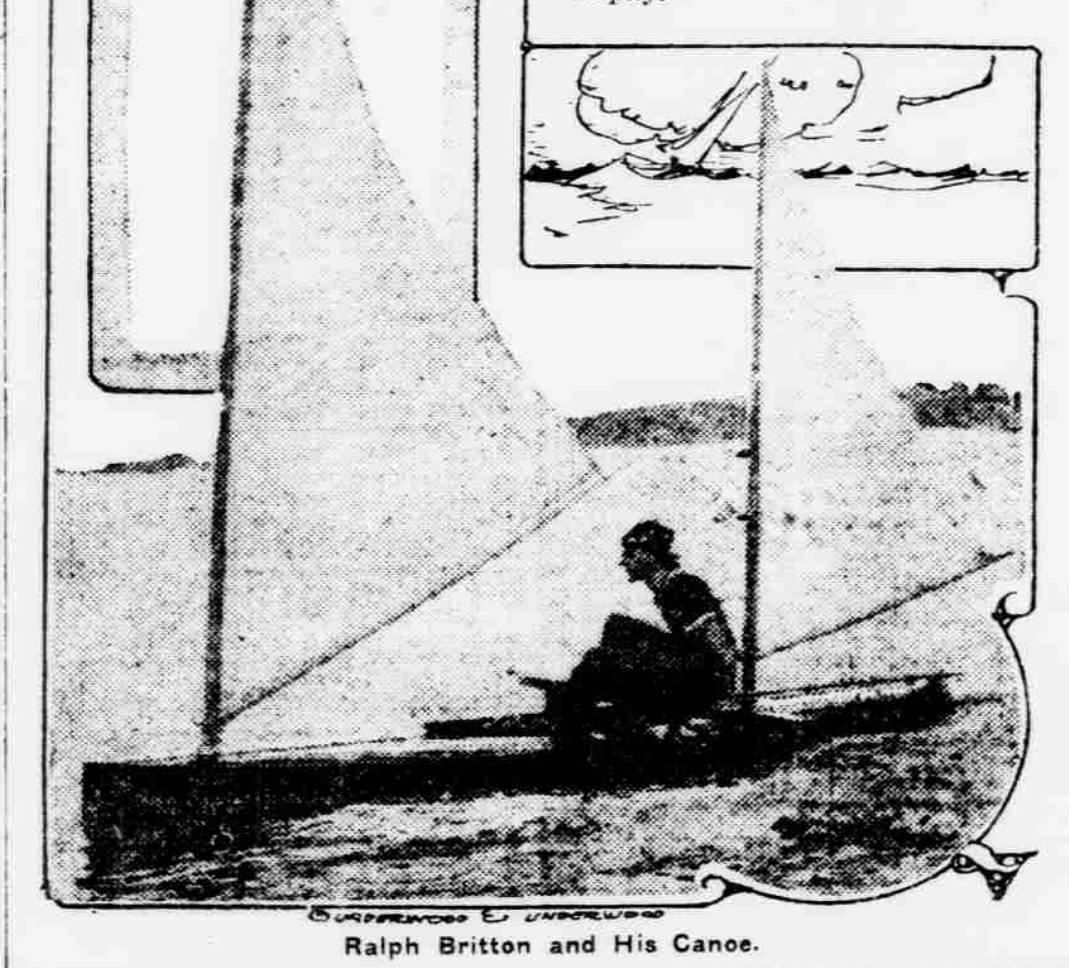
In the second Barrow got on but was turned back when Brown tapped one over by second. Buster was caught between the bases a second later and run down by Olsen and Meade.

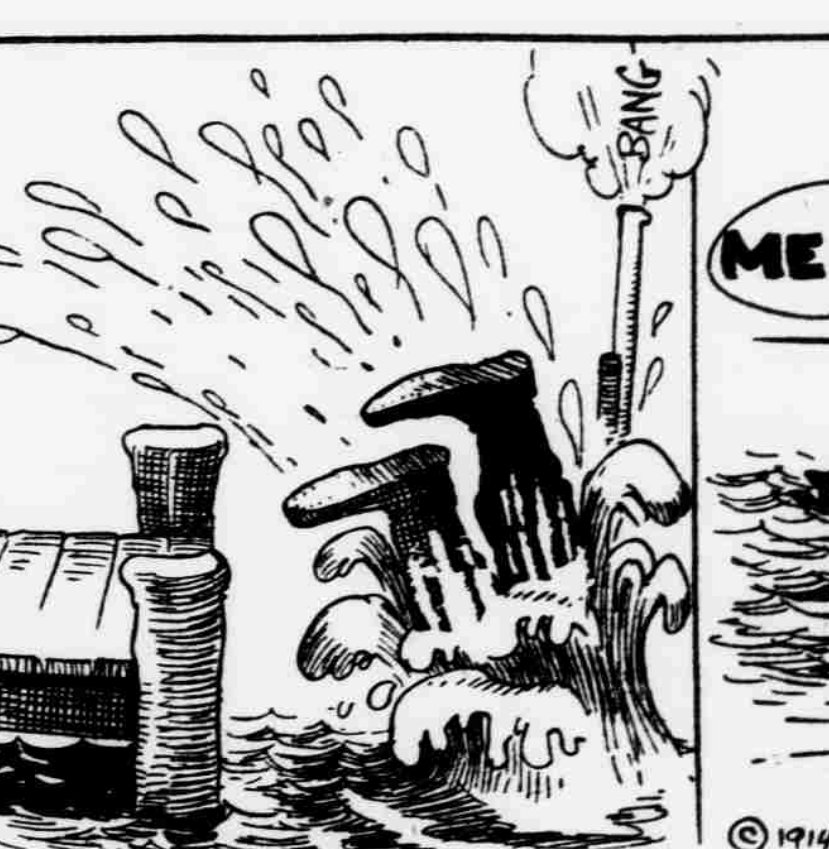
