BASS BITE AT NIGHT.

The record established by the 29-pound bass caught some days ago off the Isle of Palms beach by William E. Simmons had a narrow escape from being smashed when Robert C. Leiby, another enthusiastic Isle of Palms fisherman, pulled a 27-pounder in out of the surf on the point just across Breach inlet from Sullivan's island. Mr. Leiby, whose prowess has earned him the title of "the bass fisherman," and who would rather catch a big bass than eat or sleep, had to play the big fish for some time before he finally landed it. It measured 41 inches in length. Charles Klatte, who was with Mr. Leiby at the time, caught a shark.

Mr. Leiby not long ago put to the test and proved his theory that bass will bite at night as well as during the day, when at nine o'clock in the evening he caught a fine three-foot fish in the surf in front of his house. —Charleston News and Courier.

PLURALITY AND MAJORITY.

A presidential election in the United States almost invariably prompts the question, what is the difference in counting election returns between a majority and a plurality? The Standard Dictionary, under the head of the word-plurality gives a complete definition of the word as it is used in American politics: "The greatest of more than two numbers, whether it is or is not a majority of the whole; also, the excess of the highest number of votes cast for any one candidate over the next highest number. When a candidate for office out of 10,000 votes cast, receives 4,000 and two other candidates receive respectively 3,500 and 2,500, the first is elected by a plurality, though he has received less than a majority of the whole vote, and he is said to have a plurality of 500 votes. If the numbers are 6,000, 3,000 and 1,000 the majority is 2,000 and the plurality is 3,000."
