## FARMERS TO SAVE LARGE AMOUNTS

NEW LAW INSTIGATED BY SENATOR HOKE SMITH WILL HELP THEM.

Atlanta, June 16.—Hon. T. H. Kimbrough, member of legislature from Harris county, has received a letter from Senator Hoke Smith informing him that the department of agriculture in Washington has begun work on the cotton tare problem through the recently organized division of markets, which was established in accordance with a bill introduced at the last session of congress by Senator Smith.

It is well known that the baling of American cotton is not done with the care that is bestowed in other countries, and American farmers lose a large amount of money through defective baling and because more tare is taken off than is justified by the average weight of the baggins.

Mr. Kimbrough was appointed member of the legislative committee to investigate cotton tare, and he has been doing some hard and effective work in an effort to correct existing evils. He attended a meeting of commissioners of agriculture at Raleigh, N. C., last November, and delivered an address. A committee of cotton tare was appointed at the meeting, and Senator Smith of Georgia and Senator Smith of South Carolina were made members.

These question comes naturally within the scope of the market division of the department of agriculture. That division is intended to do everything possible to aid in the marketing of agricultural products. A large part of this work will be the collection of information in regard to markets, which will be supplied to farmers and organizations of farmers.
