THE LOAN AND THE PACIFIC MISSION.

We learn that the Cabinet, anticipating the suggestion of a contemporary that they should take the public into their confidence as fully as public interests would permit, have agreed upon a policy of keeping the press fully informed upon the results of their councils.

A fitting denouement of the crazy Samoan embassy has been nearly reached, in the commands that have gone forward to Mr. Poor, to at once realize upon Government property in that fair clime, and take the first opportunity of returning, with the balance of the legation, to Honolulu.

THE PRIVY COUNCIL.

We have heard many complaints of that feature of the new Constitution which permits the continued existence of the King's Privy Council of State, such complaints being based upon a recollection of the abuses which have been practised by that body during the past two or three years, and which the respectable minority in the Council could not restrain.

As to the powers and functions of the Council it is provided by Article 40 that it shall be "for advising the King in all matters for the good of the State, wherein he may require its advice," but its powers are expressly confined to those conferred by the Constitution in terms, and it nowhere appears that any legislative function is vested in the Council.

islature, without the sanction of an appropriation; but only then, in the emergency of "war, invasion, rebellion, pestilence or other public disaster." This is surely not a wide license to the Council, nor one to be in the least deprecated.

The only function of the Council remaining for discussion is its power to advise the King to convene the Legislature in extraordinary session, as per Article 28. This power was designed as a check upon an unwise or corrupt Cabinet, when, between sessions of the Legislature, they should so abuse their trust as to render necessary the assembling of the Legislature, upon whose vote of want of confidence, alone, such Cabinet can be dismissed (Article 41).
