THE POPE IS SATISFIED

RELIGIOUS QUESTION IN THE PHILIPPINES.

Cardinal Vaughan Gives an Authoritative Statement as to the Church's Views on American Sovereignty.

LONDON, October 3.—Cardinal Vaughan, head of the Catholic church in England, a close friend and adviser of the Pope and undoubtedly the greatest diplomat in the church, has been carefully studying the religious question of the Philippines, a subject of momentous importance to the church, and one which the Pope has viewed with great concern. He has consulted with Cardinal Vaughan concerning it, as well as with Cardinal Gibbons and Mgr. Satolli.

From interviews had with his eminence and others in authority at Westminster Palace, it can be definitely stated that the church and the Pope are glad that the United States is now in control of the Philippines and Cuba, even if it means a decrease in temporal power. The Pope sees peace, prosperity and civilization ahead in these troubled islands, all of which means greater glory and success to the Christian religion.

Cardinal Vaughan gave an interview today in the throne room of Westminster Palace, attended by Father Johnson, his ecclesiastical secretary. With the cognizance of the cardinal one of his subordinates prepared the following official statement, showing the position of the Roman Catholic church towards American sovereignty in the Philippines and West Indies:

"In all religious houses in Europe anxiety was great until it was decisively known not that the insurgents had won their battle with Spain, nor that the United States had won, but rather it was a question of military possession of the islands by American troops. Then, and not till then, did the servants of the church feel that they were safe from absolute personal molestation.

"While Spain is absolutely Roman Catholic, there is a feeling among the Roman Catholic contingency in the islands that with the insurgents there is much of the spirit that might make right, and, in consequence, there is a feeling of security in the protection of the American guns, to which they have long been strangers."

AS HE VIEWED IT.

"What's the use of us taking hold of the Philippine Islands anyhow?" asked Senator Sorghum. "It'll merely add a lot of voting territory to what we've already got." "Don't you want to see the influence of this government extended?" "No, sir. Bringing in that far away section simply looks to me like going to a lot of trouble to effect a gigantic gerrymander, without benefit, as far as I can see, to any political organization in particular.

DIAMONDS.

The production of diamonds in South Africa in 1897 has been reported to The Mineral Industry as follows: Cape Colony, 3,229,368 karats; value, £4,024,040. Orange Free State, 250,000 karats; value £400,000. Total number of karats, 3,479,368; valued at £4,424,000. The output from Cape Colony is from Du Beers and Kimberley mines, both belonging to the Du Beers company. The total value of \$21,530,338 represents practically the production of the world in 1897 of diamonds used as gems, the quantity found outside of Africa being very small. The only production of Brazil at present is in the form of black diamonds used for drills and other industrial purposes.

AN ARTIST'S MODEL.

Frau Krugermann, the oldest artist model in Berlin, died recently, 92 years old. She came from a village on the Elbe, near Magdeburg, and did not enter on her professional career until late in life, after losing her husband, who fought at Leipzig. Those who knew her can recognize her form and features in many of the works of Michael Thumann, Gussow, Hildebrand, Knau and other eminent painters.
