The Tokyo council has decided to have a street railway. The motive power is to be supplied by compressed air. Several prominent Japanese officials having seen Pain's mules and suffered from their own, decided against animal traction. The scheme is to be financed by \$3,000,000 of city bonds at 7 per cent.
