LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY
SESSION OF 1876.

Exterior Bar.—July 11.

No. Kauai presented a resolution that \$2,000 be appropriated for a breakwater at Honoulihi, Hawaii.

SENATE OF THE DAY.

Third reading of an act requiring all foreigners holding government positions to take the oath of allegiance; the motion, if voted for, was for the third time and passed.

Second reading of an act to regulate fishing rights.

Voted.

Third reading of an act to regulate the sale of opium, and after considerable discussion the motion to embody it was voted for the third time and passed.

Second reading of an act to amend section 673 of the Civil Code.

Passed to engrossment.

Second reading of an act to repeal chapter 30 of the Law of 1874.

The act relating to elections for representatives was then taken up for consideration, and passed to an immediate reading of an act relating to debts of deceased persons, and passed to engrossment.

Rejected.

Mr. Waterhouse presented a resolution that the Assembly meet next on every day at 1 p. m.

Mr. Kalakaua presented a resolution that the present Minister remain in office for seven years, and the Assembly meet again at the end of that period, on July 24, 1882.

SIXTY-EIGHT DAY.—Monday July 24.

Assembly met at 10 A. M. Vice-President Abalo in chair.

A communication from the medical adviser of the President was then read, stating that the President will not resume his duties for three days.

Mr. Waterhouse gave notice of a bill relating to agriculture.

Mr. Kalakaua gave notice of an act to amend section 673 of the Civil Code.

Mr. Kauai presented a resolution that the Secretary be instructed to pay those members who had received depreciated coins before the fall, the amount of loss on their payments. Pending the discussion the Assembly adjourned.

SIXTY-NINE DAY.—Tuesday July 25.

No. Kauai presented a resolution that the bill be appropriated for a mail carrier for Walker, Wailuku and Kailua.

No. Kauai gave notice of an act to amend sections 3 and 5 of chapter 30 of the Penal Code.

After some discussion the resolution was withdrawn.

ORDER OF THE DAY.

The Assembly went in the Committee of the Whole to consider the majority report of the Select Committee to whom was referred the bill relating to physicians.

Mr. Kalakaua presented a resolution that the bill be referred to a committee.

The Appropriation Bill was then taken up in the Committee of the Whole. Hon. Mr. Wilder in the chair.

Mr. Kauai adjourned.

SIXTY-SIXTH DAY.—Monday July 17.

Mr. Kalakaua filed a petition praying that the import be allowed to return home and three other papers. Laid on table.

Mr. Kauai from Waimea, praying that the committees of crown heads be removed, the King to approve them himself. Immediately postponed.

The majority of the select committee to whom was referred the bill to repeal the law to mitigate report that they had prepared another bill in its place laid on table till the minority report comes up.

The majority of the select committee to whom was referred the bill to secure the best medical practice, reported that the bill be passed with some amendments which the committee recommended. It was made a special order for Tuesday in the committee of the whole.

Hon. S. K. Kauai read for the first time a bill to establish a select committee as members of the Astericay, and representatives from holding government offices. Passed to its second reading.

Mr. Kauai presented a resolution that the appropriate committee be informed of Monday, Wednesday and Friday evenings were engaged.

Mr. Abalo read for the first time a bill to amend section 2 of the law regulating the Bureau of Public Instruction, appointing three native members of the Board and two foreigners. Passed to its second reading.

On re-assembling at 1 P. M. the report was laid on table.

The Assembly, on its first day, took a recess of one hour and a half's speech against the resolution.

Mr. Kauai and Kauai spoke against the resolution. Adjourned.
