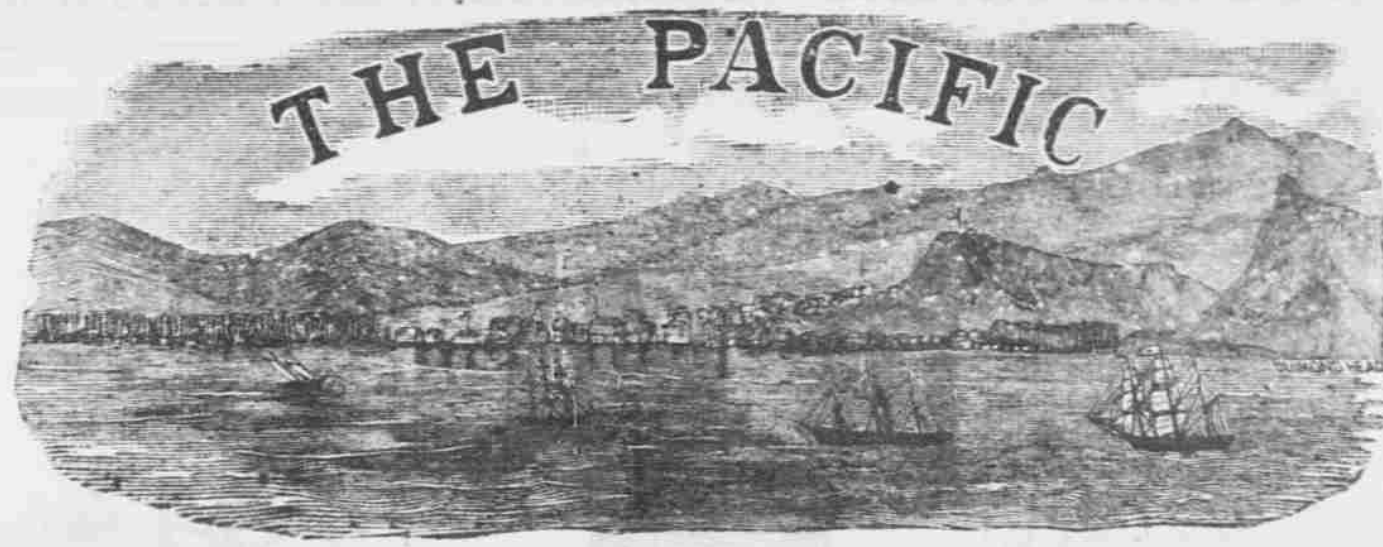

### A Whole Temperance Lecture.

### A Tall-Casting Lizard.

This lizard belongs to a large family called Geckos. They are principally found in the east and northern countries of Africa, and are remarkable for many peculiarities. Nearly all of them resemble the bark of trees, but this has the remarkable faculty of throwing off its stumpy tail when attacked, the cast-off member leaping about twisting and contorting, thus attracting the attention of the pursuer until the owner makes good its escape. If you examine the anatomy of the tail the why and wherefore of this is easily understood. The joints of the backbone are very delicately put together, and snap at the slightest warning; and almost immediately a new tail begins to grow out, and in some cases no less than two or three tails have appeared, presenting a most remarkable spectacle.

### The Issue of Cents.

The first coin ever issued in this country was the 18-fashioned cart-wheel cent. The first issue was in 1793, and there were three dies made. With the single exception of the year 1815 there has been no break in the issue of cents from that time to the present. The labor required to secure a sample of the three varieties of cents made in 1793 is very great, and they bring from \$3 to \$5 each. The cent of 1794 is a trifle more common and can be bought for about 60 cents, while a sample of the issue of 1795 is worth \$1.25. The cent was in this year that the liberty cap was changed to the fillet head, and these were issued regularly for thirteen years when the Goddess of Liberty appeared on the face of the coin, with thirteen stars surrounding it. A cent of the issue of 1799, in good condition, is worth \$40 or \$50.

### Swallowing a Chicken's Heart.

A romantic young water-girl at a hotel in Ontario, (Can.), came near losing her life the other day by trying a foolish experiment. She had heard an old saying that any girl who swallowed a chicken's heart raw would have for a husband the first male person she shook hands with, and believing the proverb, attempted to swallow a chicken's raw heart, but failed. The heart stuck in her throat and would not move either way, down or up. A doctor was called in and arrival only in season to save the deluded girl from an untimely death by choking.

### Lithographic Stones.

The discovery in California lately of considerable quantities of the peculiar stone used by lithographers is the subject of much remark in the papers of that state. Heretofore the best lithographic stones have been found at Kelheim and Solenhofen, near Pappenheim, on the Danube, in Bavaria; but they have been found also in Silesia, England, France, Canada and the West Indies. They are found in beds, commencing with layers of the thickness of paper till they reach the dimensions of one and several inches in thickness, when they are easily cut, being yet soft in the quarries, to the sizes required for printing purposes.
