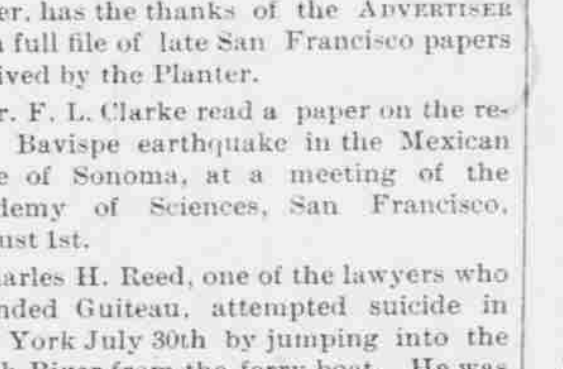

Accident to Rev. Dr. Lowell Smith.

Last Saturday morning the Rev. Dr. Lowell Smith was unharnessing his horse in the yard of the family residence, Nuuanu Valley, when a Portuguese came along and asked Dr. Smith for some medicine. In some way or another the Portuguese frightened the animal, which was not quite clear of the shafts of the carriage, and it knocked the doctor down on to his back, one of the shafts breaking at the time. The Portuguese when he saw what trouble he had caused ran away, despite the appeal of the doctor for help. About fifteen minutes afterwards a native passed by and the doctor was able to call him and ask his assistance. The native lifted the venerable doctor on to the veranda, and an express passing at the time it was hailed. Dr. Smith was placed in it and at once driven to Dr. Tucker's residence. Later on he was removed to Mr. B. F. Dillingham's residence, and there attended by Drs. Tucker and Martin. The left arm was much swollen, and the doctors think that one of the socket bones is broken. Mr. A. L. Smith, son of the venerable doctor, was down the country at the time, but hastened home on hearing of the accident. We are glad to say that at latest accounts last evening Dr. Smith was in very good spirits and resting easily. It will be some time before he will be able to use the injured arm.

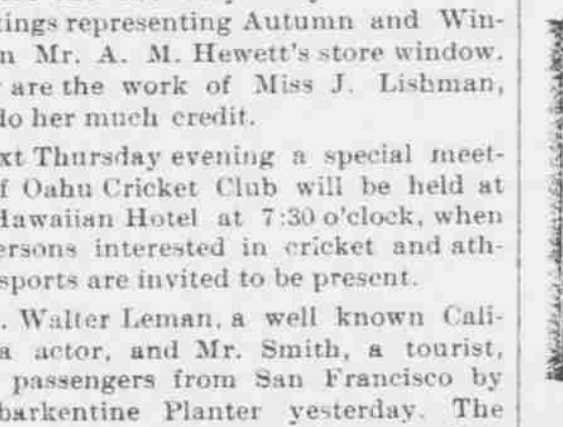
