THERE is a boom in the matrimonial market.

MARSHAL KAUKUKOU has issued an order to the liquor saloons to close from 11:30 o'clock p. m. Saturday, September 10th, to 5 o'clock a. m. Wednesday, September 14th.

A NEW movement has been started in Chicago among the workmen, founded on the principles of harmony and co-operation between employers and employees opposed to strikes and all labor demonstrations not in harmony with civil government.

LATE NEWS.

LONDON, August 25th.—The Queen arrived to-day at Balmoral. No European ruler, except the Czar, is so guarded when journeying as the Queen.

The Queen was supplied with a special time-table, printed elegantly in mauve on thick white paper, bordered in gold and surmounted by the Royal arms.

LONDON, August 25th.—It is expected that there will be serious times in Ireland after the adjournment of Parliament.

NOGALES, A. T., August 20th.—For more than two months there has been a great fatality among the residents of Hornsillo and Guaymas, and also in other towns and cities in Mexico.

SALT LAKE CITY, August 20th.—The remains of the late John Taylor were exhumed to-day and placed in a massive granite sepulchre, which had been prepared for them.

NEW YORK, August 17th.—Sir John Thurston, who has been in the British service for 22 years, and is now Commissioner for the Western Pacific, as well as Lieutenant Governor of Fiji, is at present stopping at the Windsor Hotel.
