SHIPPING NOTES. The steamer Waialeale brought yesterday from Kaula 2,343 bags sugar, 131 barrels molasses, 150 bgs sugar, and 151 hides.

The steamer Mikahala brought yesterday from Kaula 5,388 bags sugar, 110 bgs rice, 10 hides; from Niihau, 29 head cattle, 985 skins.

The steamer Lehua arrived on Sunday from Hamakua with sugar and a broken boiler from Laysan to be repaired at the Honolulu Iron Works.

The Royal Mail Steamship Zealandia sailed on Saturday evening for San Francisco with 2,300 bags sugar and 2,500 bunches bananas for transit from the Colonies.

The bark Colusa has already received 24,000 bags sugar. She will receive nearly 6,000 bags from the steamer Mikahala to-day, and is expected to sail on Wednesday for San Francisco with 32,000 bags sugar.

The American bark Ceylon, Captain R. Calhoun, arrived on Saturday afternoon, June 1, 27 days from Port Townsend, Washington State, with 105,000 feet lumber, 100,000 shingles, and 150,000 laths for Messrs. Allen & Robinson. Had south and south-west winds from Cape Flattery to latitude 40 deg. south; thence had variable winds to port. Had no trades till within 300 miles of these islands.

He was originally a whaling captain, and finally settled down as a ship-handler in this city. He was a close business man, fairly successful in whatever he undertook, and generally respected. Captain Peiro leaves behind him a widow and two daughters—one of the latter is the wife of Dr. Emerson.
