FACTS WHITTLED DOWN.
California is the only state in
the Union which at present pro-
duces quicksilver in commercial
quantities.
The richest American college is
Columbia, with an endowment of
\$9,000,000. Harvard comes second
with about \$7,000,000.
The flag which floats over the
last resting-place of General Grant
will soon be a thing of the past. It
is so tattered and torn as to seem a

Here is California's crop for the
year: Grain, 44,000,000 bushels;
wine, 18,000,000 gallons; raisins,
2,341,000 boxes; dried fruit, 525,000
tons; fresh fruit, 52,000 tons; lima
beans, 50,000 tons.
