NEWS FROM KOHALA.

**An Accident—Raining all the
 Time—Society Event.**
 Quite a serious accident occurred
 at Kohala Plantation on Tuesday,
 January 27, whereby a Japanese
 had a leg broken. It is the practice
 for one man to ride on the brake of
 each bullock wagon, and in the above
 case the wagon was upset. The
 great wonder is that there are so few
 casualties of the same nature, and in
 the case mentioned that the man es-
 caped death.
 Saturday evening, the 7th inst.,
 Mesdames Wight and Smithies gave
 a very enjoyable dancing party. The
 house was very nicely trimmed with
 flowers and ferns; music good, and
 everybody agreed that they had a
 good time. Supper was served at
 12, when the dancers began to wend
 their way homeward, and as some of
 them lived at quite a long distance,
 and had to face a tearing wind, ac-
 companying with rain, it was 4 o'clock
 ere they reached their homes. Ow-
 ing to the rain during the early part
 of the evening, quite a number were
 debarred from going, much to their
 loss. There were about thirty pres-
 ent; only about half the number
 that would have gone under more
 favorable circumstances.
 Dame Nature seems to be in the
 "melting" mood. There were
 twenty-five rainy days during last
 month, and so far in this month it
 has rained all the time, night and
 day. We hope the old lady will ex-
 haust her stock of tears soon, for we
 can almost see the moss growing on
 our hair. This is a very damp dis-
 trict even in dry times, so what must
 it be during a long rainy period! In
 spite of all the rain, our mill owners
 are rushing in the case, through
 what is gleaned from foreign papers,
