De'egate Wilcox In-pas-sionate Add-ess to Hawaii-ans.

(Continued from yesterday)
Prejudice Only in Hawaii.

"These are the people who show their prejudice against the Hawaiians. These are the people who call us niggers. Why, worthy delegates, during all the time I was in Washington I did not hear a word said of prejudice against Hawaiians. I have to come home to Hawaii to hear this kind of thing.

Would Confound Races.

"Do you want me to tell you why there is being so much talk indulged in about the dark skins of the Hawaiians? It is nothing but an attempt to confound us with the negroes and thus gain on the Mainland the prejudice that is felt against the negro race.

"These people are sore because we are on top and because there is a Hawaiian delegate in Congress instead of L. A. Thurston, that keeper of the Advertiser pig-pen. It is the same old story of greed.

"Beware, however, for the 'missionaries' also have friends in Washington who will do what they say. On the other hand, I would say stand steady for what you believe to be right, for we, too, have our staunch friends in Washington.

Drop Name "Republican."

"You will remember that when I was last here I advised you to put the word 'Republican' in place of 'Independent' in the name of our party. This I did because I had been advised so to do by influential Republican members of Congress and because I seemed to see in the action some help for us in the direction of Statehood.

"I now state to you that we have many friends among both Republicans and Democrats in Congress, and it would not do for us to offend either side. I would therefore advise you to return to your original party name of 'Home Rule Independent,' banking on this name to carry you through to victory.

Statehood Wanted.

"What we are all looking forward to is Statehood, and anything that will lead toward that end must be helped along by us. We will not mind much about the Governor then, for it will be the people who will be paramount. We will then be able to vote for the President of the United States. If the Republicans give us Statehood, then it seems to me that the Hawaiians are duty bound to join the Republican party. If, on the other hand, the Democrats be the ones, then it seems to me that we should join their party. For the present, however, let us remain the 'Home Rule Independent' party. (Great applause.)

Work of Cayless.

"I wish to say something of the work of Cayless, the last secretary of the Senate. It was he who, when I was sick, fought against Carter in the matter of Senate apportionment and won out, hands down. He contended for five Home Rule and three Republican Senators for the four-year term, while Carter wanted four each. As you know, John Brown, Kaohi, Kalua, Kalaokalani and Nakapaahu were the ones chosen for the Home Rule and Cecil Brown, H. P. Baldwin and C. L. Crabbe for the Republican side.

"I come home to you a sick man. There were many who expected that I would die, but God in His kindness did not wish it so. He was not willing that my enemies should, at this stage, have a chance to crow over my dead body.
