As long as we can keep him going on that track we needn't worry about any tariff revision. Congress will be stirred up against that rate regulation problem and there won't be any time to fool with the tariff. Then our men will pull for an internal revenue tax to supply the deficit. It's a pretty program and the Democrats will help us along in it." When it was suggested to him that the railroad men would not stand for their program, he said: "What can they do? Our men are stirring up things so as to get every body against them. We are creating adverse opinion wherever we can, and rely on the President to help us out. It's our agents instead of the people who are howling for railway rate regulation." This is authentic and comes as straight as an arrow from the inner circles of the "stand pat" Republicans. The people can see what chance they have with a Republican Congress and a Republican administration that wavers whenever the leaders snap their fingers.
