KALUNA GETS TWO YEARS.

A Tax Collector is Given a Chance to Make Good.

In the Circuit Court yesterday a native named Kaluna was convicted on a charge of larceny and was sentenced to two years in prison by Judge Cooper. A second charge of the same nature was dismissed. Kaluna was arrested about one week ago for robbing several stores in Chinatown.

All are earnestly invited to attend. The assistance of Christian workers will be welcomed. The meetings will be opened each evening with a song service. No collections will be taken.

Captain Klemme's Case.

There seemed to be pretty general approval in town yesterday of the police department's action in dispensing with Captain Carl Klemme's services. Klemme called upon both the Attorney General and the Marshal during the day. There was rather a serious expression on his face. He was talked to very plainly. Klemme has been disobeying orders and his force did about as it liked. In short it became so bad that the discipline of the entire department was threatened.

The organization has reason to believe that enemies of the Government have been active in plotting. For this reason the club will pledge anew its fealty to the Republic and to the cause of annexation. The loyal Hawaiians say they stand solidly to resist any assault from any quarter directed at the present Government.
