The barkentine Amelia sailed from Port Gamble on the 2nd inst, for Honolulu, with 700,000 feet of lumber.

The German bark Paul Isenberg, from Bremen for Honolulu, was spoken on September 24 in lat. 26 S, long. 46 W.

The barks C. D. Bryant and R. P. Rithet, left San Francisco for Honolulu on October 28th and November 1st respectively.

The Kinau arrived early yesterday morning from Hilo and way ports. After discharging her freight she was docked at the railway. She will leave port again on Friday.

Findings of the missing ship Ivanhoe recently reached San Francisco. She was caught in a gale off Cape Flattery on September 28th and went down with all hands on board.

YOKOHAMA, Nov. 5 - The British steamer Gaelic from San Francisco, which was seized by the Japanese authorities on the ground that she was carrying contraband of war, was allowed to sail, as it was found upon investigation the suspicion was unfounded.

The steamer Daisy Kimball, formerly employed in the California coast trade, left San Francisco on the 5th inst, for Honolulu via Hilo.
