

FREE SUGAR PUT ON THE SHELF.

It Will Not Come Up Before the Present Congress.

MORGAN TALKS OF THE CANAL.

Armenia Begs For Help—Death of De Lesseps—Nicaragua Bill To Be Passed Soon—Opening of the Reichstag—Sugar Planters Charge Conspiracy.

WASHINGTON, December 12.—At 2 o'clock, Gray (D.), of Delaware, stated that he had no desire to delay consideration of the canal bill, but he considered the tariff bills of greater importance, and he thought the Senate should have an opportunity to say whether these bills should be considered. It was the duty of the Senate to meet the challenge implied in the bills. He did not think the discussion of the bills would occasion any great delay. He therefore moved to displace the canal bill with the sugar bill.

Senator Morgan stated that, while he favored the sugar bill, he should be compelled to vote against its consideration at the present time, owing to the fact that he had been placed in charge of the Nicaragua canal bill.

The bill as it came from the House and as it was amended by the Senate Finance Committee was then read, after which Senator Berry (D.), of Alabama, demanded the ayes and noes on the question of consideration. There was much shifting of chairs while the vote was proceeding, and no little delay in the announcement of the result. When the announcement did come it showed the defeat of Gray's motion by a vote of 23 to 27.

A New Naval Station.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5.—The volcanic political conditions of the South and Central American republics and the numerous uprising in recent years which necessitated great activity for the Navy, have led Secretary Herbert to create the South Pacific station, with headquarters for the fleet at Valparaiso or Callao. The station is now embraced with the Pacific station, which practically extends from Alaska on the north to Cape Horn on the south, and west to Hawaii. The Olympia will soon become the flagship of the North Pacific station, and some one of the smaller vessels will be made flagship of the South Pacific. Two or three vessels will be assigned to the new station, and when possible they will be ships of the smaller class.

Senator Quay's Amendment.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5.—In the Senate today Senator Quay proposed a substitute for the sugar bill now pending in the Senate in the shape of an amendment. It strikes out all of the bill after the enacting clause and inserts the following: "That so much of the act entitled 'An act to reduce taxation, to provide revenue for the Government and for other purposes,' as provides that upon all sugars above No. 16 Dutch, standard in color, and upon all sugars which have been discolored, there shall be levied and paid a duty of an eighth of one cent per pound, in addition to a duty of 40 per cent. ad valorem, is hereby repealed."

Armenia Begs for Help.

LONDON, Dec. 11.—A dispatch from Constantinople says that the arrest of the Armenians there continues. A meeting of 3,000 Armenians was held in Varna Sunday to protest against the atrocities. A deputation from the meeting, followed by a crowd of people, visited the foreign consuls and appealed to them to ask their governments to execute Article 61 of the Berlin treaty.

May Be Passed Soon.

WASHINGTON (D. C.), Dec. 6.—The friends of the Nicaragua canal bill are moving in both Houses to have the measure passed during the present session. Speaker Crisp is understood to be favorable to it, and the Committee on Rules is therefore likely to make some provision whereby it may be taken up and acted upon without delay.

Sugar Planters Protest.

NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 4.—A meeting of the sugar planters' Association has been called for tomorrow to protest against the alleged conspiracy of the sugar trust to get control of the sugar crop of the State, to prevent the planters from selling their product elsewhere and forcing them to sell to the trust on its own terms.

Another Free Silver Bill.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5.—Senator Power today introduced a bill providing for the free coinage of silver, making the silver dollar to consist of 412 2/3 grains of standard fineness, and these dollars to be a legal tender for all debts, legal and private.

Opening of the Reichstag.

BERLIN, Dec. 5.—The session of the Reichstag was opened at noon today in Eittersale of the castle, instead of the White Hall, which is being renovated. Emperor William delivered his speech from the throne.

Death of a Minister.

WINDSOR (England), Dec. 12.—Sir John Thompson, the Canadian Prime Minister, expired here today after the meeting of the Privy Council, at which he was sworn in as a member.

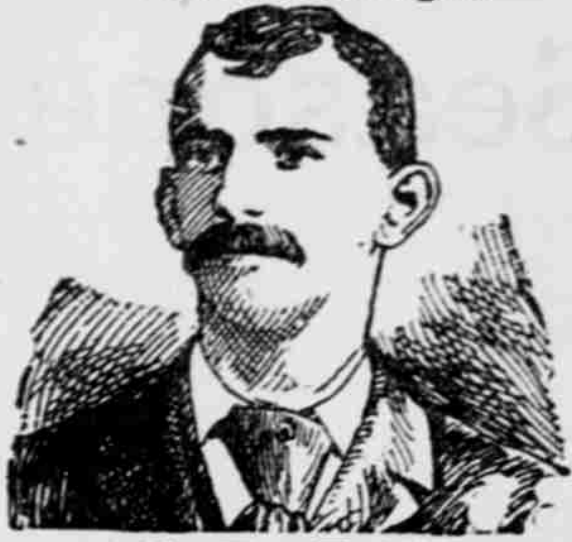
Death of De Lesseps.

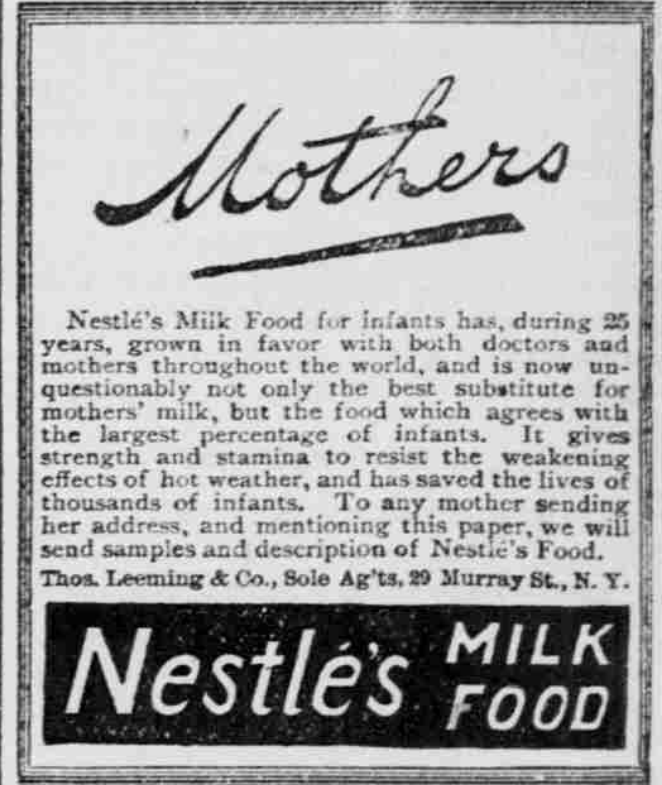
