

BREVITIES.

The band played at the Executive Building yesterday morning. The steamer Kaala arrived at 1 o'clock this morning from Kahuku. The Alameda may be along tonight. She will bring late foreign news. Two thousand rifles is said to be the amount of arms landed by the Waimanalo. George Madden, a sailor from the bark Routenbeck, was arrested yesterday for refusing duty. The funeral of the late J. T. Waterhouse, Sr., will take place this afternoon at 3 o'clock. The sale of the Kirkwood property at Lahaina has been postponed until next Saturday. Quite a number of stores were open yesterday; of these, the majority had but one door open. The Custom House was open for a short time yesterday morning, but no business was carried on. Lieutenant Holi and Officer Logan, who were shot the other night, passed a comfortable night. All island and foreign vessels will be detained and searched before being allowed to come into port. Many people anticipating trouble in the city visited friends and relatives up the valley, remaining over night. Many people have been climbing to the top of Punchbowl during the past two days to view the battle at Waikiki. All bills and claims against the bark Routenbeck must be sent to Theo. H. Davies & Co., Ltd., not later than Friday. A number of men who were formerly called royalists, are now carrying guns in defense of the Republic. Good for them. Charlie Peterson, the lookout at Diamond Head, telephoned the weather report last night for the first time since the revolution. Mrs. George Farnham, of New York, who injured her arm so seriously in a fall at Honolulu sugar mill, is recovering slowly. A special meeting of the board of trustees of the Queen's Hospital will be held at 10:30 o'clock this morning at the Chamber of Commerce.

People up the valley sat on their porches and hung on their fences yesterday wlaying their friends for the "latest news" as they came from town. The Chinese and Japanese stores of the city have been kept open continually during the past few days. The owners do not seem to notice anything that takes place. The street car horses are enjoying a well earned vacation. The cars will not run until further notice. Officer Greene, of the Humane Society, is happy in consequence. Chester A. Doyle and Tommy Hobron went up Punchbowl last night in a brake in advance of the military, and made a search—finding no evidence, however, of any armed force. Several pleasure-seekers from the States are bewailing the hard luck of having to waste precious time here in the city instead of making a trip to the other islands, which they anticipated. Squad 5 of the Citizens' Guard, who have been so kindly remembered during their stay in the Masonic building, wish to express their thanks for coffee and sandwiches received from Mrs. Dr. Day and Mrs. Dr. Wood, and a box of cigars from Hollister & Co. The Government has learned that in the plan of attack Sunday night the rebels planned on reinforcements which were to arrive from Maui on the Kinau. These men were to attract attention to the water front while the crowd at Bertelmann's came in over the Waikiki road.
