Leaders of the Rebellion Hear the Decision of the Court.

THE DEATH PENALTY COMMUTED

Nowlein, Bertelmann and W. C. Lane Released.

35 YEARS AND FINE OF \$10,000

Gulick, Seward, Rickard and Wilcox Practically Given Life Sentences—Evidence Furnished by Nowlein and Bertelmann Results in Their Freedom—Widemann Gets Thirty Years—All Sentenced to Hard Labor.

(From Gazette Extra Steamer Edition, Saturday morning.)

The leaders of the rebellion received the sentence of the Military Commission this morning at 9:30. Major Potter and Major McLeod appeared at the Marshal's office at 9 o'clock, and with Marshal Hitchcock immediately proceeded to the prison.

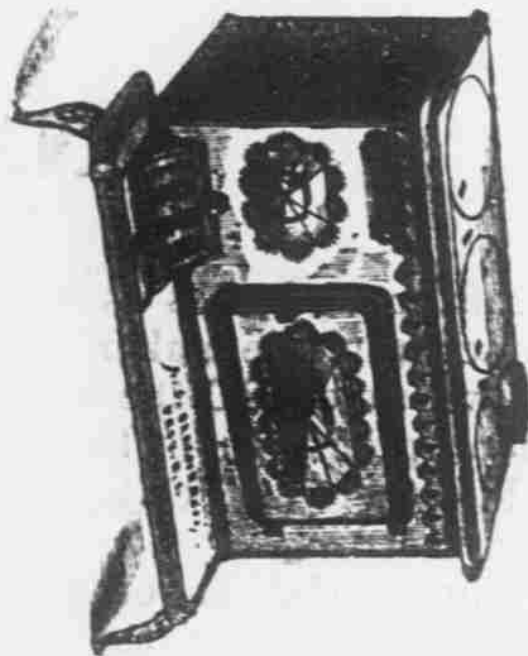
