# CAN'T FIND HER BURIED GOLD

## BEEF GOING AT TEN CENTS

METROPOLITAN MEAT COMPANY HAS OPENED A STORE IN THE CHINESE MARKET AND IS ATTEMPTING TO PUT THE PAKE BUTCHERS OUT OF BUSINESS—A BITTER FIGHT BEING WAGED WITH YEE HOP—MEANWHILE THE PUBLIC GETS THE BENEFIT.

A war to the knife, literally to the knife, is on between the Metropolitan Meat Company and the well known Chinese firm of Yee Hop & Company and as a result the general public has a chance to get meat at a reasonable figure. It was over a month ago that the Metropolitan Meat Company decided to cease selling to Chinese but the Chinese butchers took counsel and as a result Yee Hop undertook to become a purchaser of cattle himself and a middleman with whom the other pakes could deal. He found that the Holts were not in with the graziers' combine and was able to purchase beef on the hoof from them. As a come back the Metropolitan Meat Company went into the Chinese meat business itself by fitting up a shop in the King street

market and running it under the name of a Chinaman who was placed in charge. Nor is that all, for the Metropolitan's Chinese store promptly cut the price of beef down to the flat rate of 10 cents a pound a cut which, as the other Chinese have been paying from 9 1/2 to 12 1/2 cents a pound to the graziers, could not very well be met. It did not take very long for the word to pass around and since May 1 the thrifty housekeepers who have been "in the know" have been buying Metropolitan meat at its pake store for 10 cents when for exactly the same quality of meat in the up town store from 20 to 25 cents was charged.

As soon as the Metropolitan people found that Yee Hop was doing the

## RUSSIANS SUNK THE DONSKOI

Washington, June 1st, 1905. To the Japanese Consul-General, Honolulu:

The seventh report made by Admiral Togo in accordance with the reports of our various divisions runs as follows: "It appears that the Oshibara was seriously damaged in the early stage of the battle on the 27th of May and left the line and sunk at 5 p. m. Sesoievliki, Nachimoff and Monomach suffered heavily in the middle of May 27th and were so damaged by the night attack of our destroyer and torpedo-boat flotillas that they were completely put out of action. They were discovered next morning drifting near Tsushima by our converted cruisers, Shinanomaru, Yawatomaru, Tainanmuru and Sedomaru, but sank before the capture of survivors. About 915 were taken up by converted cruisers above mentioned and by inhabitants on the coast. It is certain from the statement of prisoners that the Nabarin was struck by four torpedoes from our torpedo-boat flotillas and sunk. According to the reports from the commander of the Nittaka the Svetlana was discovered at 9 a. m. on May 28th off Chihuhun Bay, Korea, and sunk by the Nittaka and the Otowa. The Aurora and the Almaz are suspected to have sunk during our torpedo attack on the night of May 27th. The fate of the Benichung which was previously reported to have sunk, is uncertain after all. Eight battleships, three armored cruisers and three coast defence ironclads which formed the Russian main force were sunk or captured, and most of the second-class cruisers and other subsidiary vessels were destroyed."

that the whole Russian squadron was practically annihilated. Regarding the damages to our fleet, subsequent reports show that during the night attack of May 27, torpedo-boats 34, 25 and 69 were sunk, but most of their crew was rescued by their companions, otherwise no ship whatever lost. The damages to our larger vessels including destroyers are very slight and none of them is incapacitated for action. Our total casualties so far estimated are 806. As nearly the whole of Japanese and Russian fleets engaged in the battle, the line was greatly extended. Moreover weather having been misty it was impossible to see more than five miles and therefore I was unable to keep in sight of all divisions under me even in daytime. Beside the battle extended two days and nights and as our various divisions attacked the enemy scattering in every direction and some are still engaged in duties subsequent to the battle, it will have some days before details can be forwarded."

TAKAMI R. Washington, June 1st, 1905. To the Japanese Consul-General, Honolulu:

The eighth report from Togo is as follows: "The commander of the Kasoga who returned this afternoon with survivors from the Fomiri Donskoi reports that the Donskoi on the morning of May 29, opening Kingaton valve sunk and those on board including survivors from the Oshibara and destroyer Bouinai landed at Ulsung Island. It appears that the Bouinai took aboard Rojstvensky

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 1.—The government at Tokio reports that most of the subsidiary vessels of Rojstvensky's fleet were destroyed in the recent battle with Admiral Togo's fleet, the Russian fleet being thus practically annihilated.

## OVATION TO ALFONSO

## Lost At Port Arthur

(Associated Press Cable to The Star).

TOKIO, June 1.—The marine department has finally announced the loss of the battleship Yashima and the protected cruiser Takasago, two gun-boats and two torpedoers during the siege of Port Arthur.

The loss of the battleship Yashima was announced in a dispatch from Paris last August or September, as having taken place in June or July. It was denied at the time by the Japanese authorities, and there was much controversy over the matter. But the Japanese government was so careful and insistent in its denials that these had come to be generally accepted. The announcement of their loss at this time shows that Togo went into the battle in the Straits of Korea with fewer vessels than he had been credited with.

## Hid It And Forgot Where

AN AGED NATIVE WOMAN WHO BURIED THE SAVINGS OF A LONG LIFE SOMEWHERE NEAR DIMOND HEAD AND HAS FORGOTTEN COMPLETELY WHERE SHE HID IT—ANXIOUS SEARCH IS BEING MADE FOR THE VALUABLE TREASURE.

Buried somewhere about, immediately across the road from the Campbell cottage at Diamond Head is a pot of money, no mean little pot with a few dollars, but a good sized jar in which are gold coins by the handful—and the owner does not know just where it is!

Mrs. Makahiki is the rightful owner of the money and she alone knew where she buried it, but she is an aged native woman, nearly ninety years have passed over her whitened head, and her memory as to the place that she put her property for safe-keeping has gone completely. Ever since it was decided to widen the Diamond Head road she and others under her direction have been hunting about the premises for the hidden treasure but so far without results. The property juts out into the road just beyond the Campbell property and an irregular triangle will be cut from the frontage in order to do away with the awkward

Some two years ago the old lady fell from the lot have already been felled and the treasure seekers are getting anxious lest the Public Works employees come along before the money is found and locate it during their operations. Mrs. Makahiki has been a retainer of the Campbell family for much more than a score of years and has lived at the Diamond Head place ever since the estate was bought. The lot which she is now searching over is her own property, and she also has other real estate. Being of a saving nature she had little occasion to spend much of the money that came to her in the course of her long life. ## CARTER'S POSITION

WANTS TO KNOW IF THE REPUBLICAN PARTY IS SUPPORTING ANTI-ADMINISTRATION CANDIDATES FOR COUNTY OFFICERS—SAYS THAT THE NEXT MOVE IS UP TO THE PARTY AND THE VOTERS.

Governor Carter this morning expressed in an interview with a Star representative, his view of the position of the Republican party and the candidacy of A. M. Brown for sheriff of Oahu.
