QUESTION OF EXTRA SESSION

GOVERNOR NOT DECIDED ABOUT RESULT OF A DECISION AGAINST COUNTY ACT.

"I have not come to any decision as to whether a special session of the legislature will be necessary in the event that the County Act is declared unconstitutional," said Governor Carter this morning.

"I have been quoted as saying that it would be a 'dangerous precedent' to call an extra session under such circumstances," Carter said, "but I have never made any such remark. The problem is a bridge which I don't propose to cross until I come to it, and all I can say as to my intentions in the matter is that I have not reached any decision one way or the other."

The situation is not the same as it was two years ago. When appropriations were in doubt, at that time there were two appropriation bills, a six months bill and an eighteen months bill, and it was a question which applied. A decision on the point was secured from the Supreme Court, and it may be of use now as a guide.

DECISIONS ARE COMING

CHIEF JUSTICE FEAR AND ASSOCIATE JUSTICE HARTWELL TO LEAVE FOR MAINLAND.

Chief Justice Fear and Associate Justice Hartwell are both to leave for the mainland by the transport Thomas next Tuesday, and the Supreme court will therefore take an adjournment for some weeks.

and his staff before the sinking of the flagship in the afternoon of the 27th of May and also 299 from the Orelbia which, finding navigation difficult, transferred Rostovsky and his staff to the Dosloni and while running northward met in the morning of May 28th the Donskoi to which all aboard were transferred and the Boulni sank herself. The Orelbia, according to other survivors' statements, had the conning tower struck at the first straight shot of the battle on May 27th and Admiral Foelkershan was killed and after the succession of shots sank at about 2 p. m.

CRUISING YACHTS HAVE RETURNED

VESSELS MAKE OAHU FROM HANAIEI AFTER ENCOUNTERING CALMS AND BAFFLING WINDS.

The yacht cruise to Hanalei and return was finished last night by the Hawaii and La Paloma. The Paloma arrived at Puaolo harbor at 8 p. m. and the Hawaii at Honolulu at 10 p. m.

The Hawaii left Honolulu about 2:30 Saturday afternoon and the Paloma left Pearl Harbor at 4 p. m. the same day. The Paloma arrived at Hanalei at 11 o'clock the following morning and the other vessel an hour and a half later.

Returning the yachts left Hanalei together at 5 p. m. on Monday. They encountered calms and baffling winds coming home. The entire trip was delightful however. In the La Paloma were Clarence Macfarlane, T. W. Mohron and two native sailors, and in the Hawaii were Ollie Sorenson, George Crozier, Mr. Lyle and Captain John.

BALLOU'S SUIT AGAINST PARKER

ATTORNEY'S ACTION FOR \$50,000 FOR LIBEL BEGUN BEFORE LINDSAY TODAY.

The libel suit of S. M. Ballou against Col. Sam Parker was begun this morning in Judge Lindsay's court. A. G. M. Robertson appeared for Ballou, who also appeared in person, while Parker was represented by J. A. Maroon, R. W. Breckons and Judge Whiting.

The suit is for \$50,000 damages claimed on account of statements in an answer filed by Parker or his attorneys in the matter of the Annie T. K. Parker estate. The statements which are claimed as libelous were to the effect that Ballou, who is of counsel against Parker in the case as such committed a "gross violation" of his professional duties to Samuel Parker and, as Parker expressed his belief, had rendered himself unfit to practice his profession in the Territory of Hawaii.

The morning was occupied in getting a jury. Part of the defense, as stated in an affidavit filed on a motion for a postponement, is that Parker did not make the statements alleged by the plaintiff to be his.
