ANOTHER ROYAL PRINCE DUE.

It is learned from authoritative sources that the Crown Prince of Siam will come to the United States in the same simple manner that he has visited King Edward and the various continental rulers, accompanied only by his brothers, the next in succession to the Crown Prince, and two able officers in the Siamese army. The Crown Prince is in his twenty-second year, and for more than eight years has lived in England, speaking and writing the language. He has been educated at Oxford, in president of the Cosmopolitan club of that university, and is most simple and unaffected in his manner. He is said to be thoroughly imbued with Western civilization, as also is his father, the King of Siam. He will call on the President and Secretary of State officially, either in Washington or such other place as the American authorities may designate.

WOMEN'S WORK.

It is true that in a good many directions more and more women find employment—many more are teachers and clerks, for instance, but the great decrease in the number of domestic servants brings down the general percentage.
