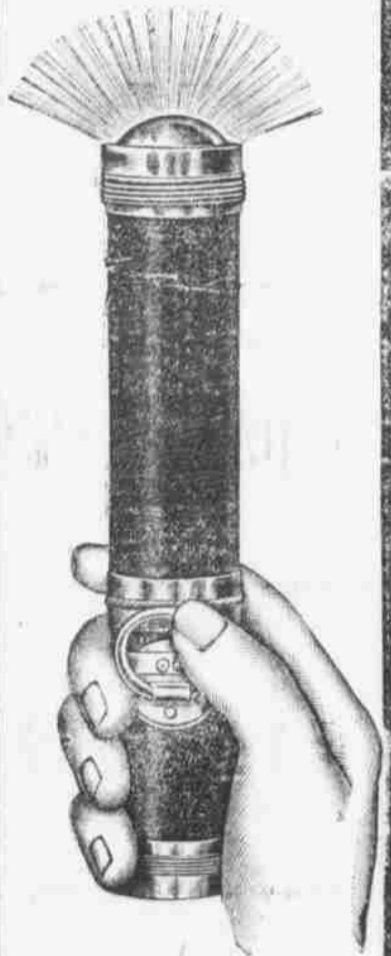

H. Wilson of the big contracting firm of Wilson, Lyons & Company of San Francisco, arrived by the Souma yesterday. He comes to look over the field of the Kona-Kau Railroad before entering upon the work of building the road.

Mrs. Fannie I. Helmut, one of the founders of the first woman's club in the United States, and the first president of the American Federation of Woman's clubs, was a passenger on the Ventura yesterday passing through Honolulu.

An adjourned meeting of the Republican Territorial Central Committee will be held at Republican headquarters on Saturday evening next, January 17, at 7:30 o'clock. The business of the meeting is to receive the County bill, as prepared by the special committee authorized at the last Territorial convention, with a report thereon.

PRETORIA, Jan. 8.—An influential meeting of burghers yesterday drafted an address for presentation to Colonial Secretary Chamberlain and the Legislative Council, embodying the views of the leaders. Among the recommendations are general amnesty, the maintenance of the Transvaal's pre-war regulations regarding natives, the importation of cattle by the Government and their sale to the burghers at actual cost and the abolition of the South African constabulary. Generals Botha, De Wet and De La Rey strongly urged the necessity for a moderate attitude and organization to assist the present Government. General Botha reported that \$25,000 had been collected in America and Europe for the relief of the destitute Boers.

A JAPANESE WAS ROBBED. H. Kishi, a hack driver, reported to the authorities this morning that he had been robbed by a burglar last night. The Japanese lives on Vineyard street on the Ewa side of the Queen hotel. He left the door to his room open last night. Early this morning while dressing he discovered that he had been robbed. A gold plated watch valued at \$23 and a purse containing \$14.50 were stolen. The robber is supposed to have entered the room while Kishi slept.
