THE LOG-BOOK

S. S. Korea, sailed yesterday from San Francisco and is due here December 28, in the morning.
 Captain Matson awaits mail information from Honolulu concerning the local attitude in regard to his new boat before he concludes whether she shall be freight and passenger or merely freight.

S. S. Hilonian sails for San Francisco on December 29 at 10 a. m. She takes refined sugar and other island produce.

A Mahukona wireless reveals fears for Captain Neilsen and a boat's crew of the schooner H. C. Wright that they were lost in Sunday's storm while fishing. Those ashore thought the men were picked up.

The commission given Japanese hotel keepers by steamship companies doing business here, for passengers secured, which meant \$2 per head, has been discontinued.

Local interests recommend to the Matson Company that the S. S. Lurline return to Honolulu after visiting Kahului en route to the coast.

STEAMER FOR ISLAND ROUTE.
 SAN FRANCISCO, December 13--The large freight steamer Pleiades, which has been on Puget Sound for a long time, has been chartered by the American-Hawaiian Steamship Company to ply between this port and ports of Hawaii. The Pleiades is a sister ship of the Hyades, recently chartered by the Matson Navigation Company for use on the triangle route connecting this city with Puget sound and Honolulu. It has been reported that competition between the Matson line and the American-Hawaiian Company would probably be keen, since each had secured an additional freighter for the island trade, but the story of a prospective rate war is denied by officials of both concerns.

The large steamers of the American-Hawaiian line are now used on the route connecting Salina Cruz with this city and Puget sound, the vessels sailing from the sound for the Hawaiian Islands on the way back to Salina Cruz. This leaves the company without a steamer for the line connecting this city with Honolulu direct, and it is for this trade that the Pleiades has been chartered. The business of the line is reported to be very good, and the coming sugar crop will add to the traffic.
