We are educating these young people to become, under certain circumstances a dangerous class, or under other circumstances to become a most desirable class.

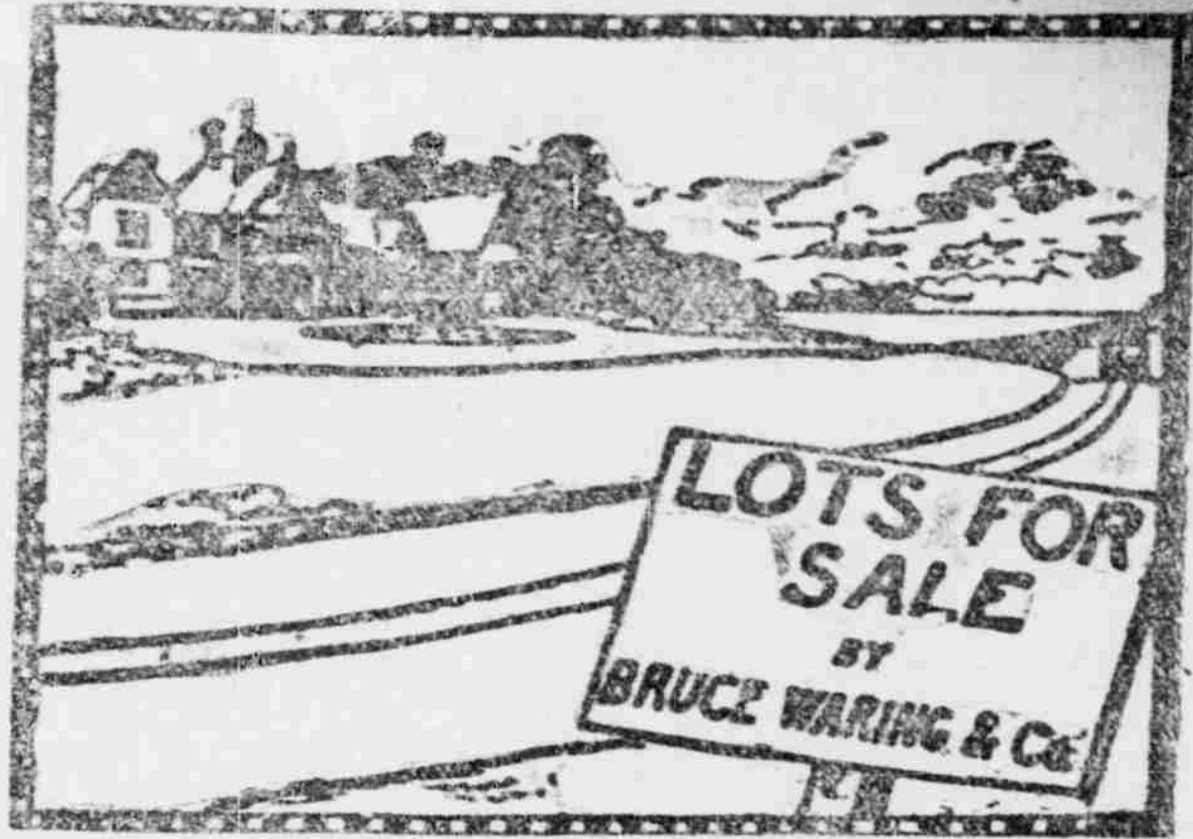
