The schooner Wm. Bowden, Fjerem master, sailed for San Francisco Sunday with the following cargo: 24,300 bags sugar, weighing 2,804,850 pounds, valued at \$98,000 and shipped by Wm. G. Irwin & Co. to Alexander & Baldwin.

The American bark Martha Davis, Soule master, arrived in port Sunday with a cargo of 600 tons of general merchandise for C. Brewer & Co. The Martha Davis had an uneventful trip. Wm. Norton received 22 mules on her and the California Wine Co. one horse.

The Noeau came in from Honokaa with a load of sugar on Saturday. Her report is as follows: Fine weather on the Hamakua coast. Mauna Loa was discharging freight at Kailua when left. There are 1200 bags of sugar left at Honouapo, 500 at Kukuihaele and 8500 at Honokaa.

Overloaded.

The barkentine Harvester, well known in this port, has left San Francisco for the Alaska salmon canneries.

Several captains of the Spreckels tow-boats who watched her departure claimed that the Harvester was shamefully overcrowded and that there was a strong probability that she would meet with mishap before she reaches her destination.

She has over 500 tons of cargo aboard, including a large quantity of tin plate, and her decks were covered with ponderous steam launches and several other kinds of small craft.

In her limited passenger accommodations were crowded together 59 Italians, 60 Chinese and 20 American cannery hands, who are packed away in bunks like sardines in every available inch of space below her decks.

In addition to the steam launches and other boats, 20,000 feet of lumber were also lashed above board, giving the vessel a dangerously top-heavy appearance.
