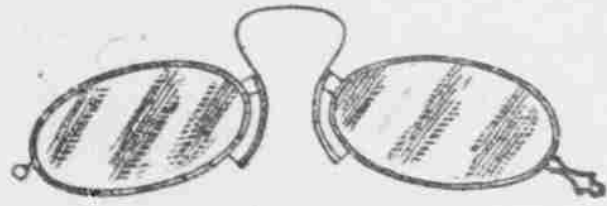

MAUI NOTES.

People who arrived from Maui ports on the Mauna Loa yesterday afternoon report very dry weather there. Matters have come to such a pass that much of the vegetation is burning. Judge Kalua of the Second Circuit, has returned to his home in Maui after attending Court at Kailua in the place of Judge Hitchcock, unable on account of illness to attend to his duties.

Judge Kepoikai and his family will be down from Maui on the Maui, Sunday. This will bring him here in plenty of time to take his seat in the Senate on Monday morning. According to statements made by various of the passengers from Maui on the Mauna Loa, the people there are very much pleased with the election of Judge Kepoikai in the Senate.
