One man is still "under the steps." Gen. M. Churchill, who visited Honolulu some time ago, is here again, having arrived by the S. S. City of Peking. The metal ceiling is now being placed in the new building of the Inter-Island Steam Navigation Company on Queen street. Clarence Macfarlane had his new vapor launch out in the channel for a short trial trip Saturday. She behaved beautifully. A drunken native was badly bruised about the head yesterday by being run down by a hack on King street. The driver was a Pake. For one month only C. R. Collins will make a big cut on all horse supplies. In some instances the cut amounts to fifty per cent. H. G. Wootton gives notice that W. W. Chamberlain is authorized to collect all accounts during Mr. Wootton's absence from the Islands. Jas. McCandless writes from Kaunakakai that he is making good progress in sinking the first well for a trial for artesian water at that place. Per C. D. Bryant, J. T. Waterhouse received a large invoice of Haviland China in plain and fancy designs. Some of the few sets are displayed in the store window. Circuit Court for the May term opens at the Judiciary Building this morning. The jury panel list has been given in this paper, as well as mention of the principal cases. On Wednesday evening of this week the Geo. W. De Long Post, G. A. R., of this city, will outline the program for Memorial Day, May 30. There will be elaborate observance. It is said that W. G. Walker, who has been quite successful as manager of Ookala plantation, will take charge of cane fields and mill for the new Molokai Ranch Company. The advertisement of "A B C," who wishes to get into communication with men willing to go into the service of the United States against Spain, appears again this morning. At midnight it was announced that the S. S. City of Peking could not sail till between 4 and 5 a. m. There was more work than expected in discharging freight and taking on coal. Aboard the S. S. City of Peking are a number of officers of the Japanese Navy en route to San Francisco to take charge of the warship being built for Japan by the Union Iron Works. One man secured a discharge from Company F of the N. G. H., on Saturday and left for the States by the City of Peking to enlist in the United States Army for the war with Spain. The dancing party for this week will be the hop at the Healan Boat Club's quarters, on the bay, on Friday evening. The affair promises to be a most pleasant one with a large attendance. C. S. Desky had as guests in his Cyclomere pavilion, Saturday evening a party including Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Irwin and Consul General and Mrs. Haywood. All enjoyed the racing very much. There is still much talk of two in three heats for harness racing at Kapiolani Park Track on Kamehameha Day. The reform will be urged upon the Jockey Club by men who are in earnest. Judge Carter will go to Molokai to live. He will build a fine mansion in the mountains where he can see Hawaii, Maui, Lanai and Oahu. His family will soon accompany him to the new home. Leslie Scott of the Custom House returned from a most pleasant vacation of a fortnight, spent in the mountains of Molokai. During his stay, he and Ernest Renken killed 90 deer, as well as other game. There were rumors yesterday that there had been negotiations in Yokohama for the purchase of the City of Peking by the United States Government but the officers seemed to know nothing at all about it. Sunday was a busy day for the Rev. C. L. Pearson, Methodist pastor. He led the service in Kamehameha Chapel at 11 in the forenoon, preached at the Peninsula in the afternoon and at Ewa in the evening.
