CRICKET RECORD.

A New Top Score is Established in Australia.

The Australian University Cricketers XI have covered themselves with glory by being the first team in the world that has made 1,000 runs in a single inning. Some people were under the impression that the Essendon men allowed runs to be made towards the attainment of the thousand, but the on-lookers said that they never lagged in the fielding and bowling and that very few errors were made in the match. It was simply due to the powerful batting of the university team on a very dry ground.

Nine Hundred and twenty runs was, up to the time of the following score, the world's record and was made in America in 1882.
