Two divers were busy at work yesterday cleaning the bottom of the Bennington.

The C. D. Bryant and the Andrew Welch were searched yesterday by the Customs House officers.

The Noeau sailed for Kauai ports yesterday afternoon. A number of mules were shipped by Paul R. Isenberg.

Business in the boat line is very dull just at the present time. Eleven boats have been laid up to await better times.

The Albert will haul over to the railroad wharf this morning for the purpose of discharging the big boiler brought down here for the Oahu plantation.

The Paroo will not continue on her journey northward until Friday or Saturday. It is taking longer to discharge her coal than was at first anticipated.

The Moif Wahine was unable to get away yesterday. She will sail at 8 o'clock this morning for her usual Hakua ports, taking along a full cargo of coal and general merchandise.

Only the Japanese laborers brought by the S. S. City of Peking are now at Quarantine Island. Those brought by the tramp steamer Mogul have been dispatched to various plantations.

The Mauna Loa was forced to discharge at the Oceanic wharf yesterday afternoon on account of the crowded condition of the Inter-Island wharf. The boats of that company took away a great amount of cargo yesterday.

The Mauna Loa arrived in port at about 11:15 a. m. yesterday after a very fine trip from Maui and Hawaii ports. The weather on both these Islands, could not have been better. The purser reports that Pahala plantation started grinding again on Monday. The new mill is being used for the first time and everything is working in most excellent shape.

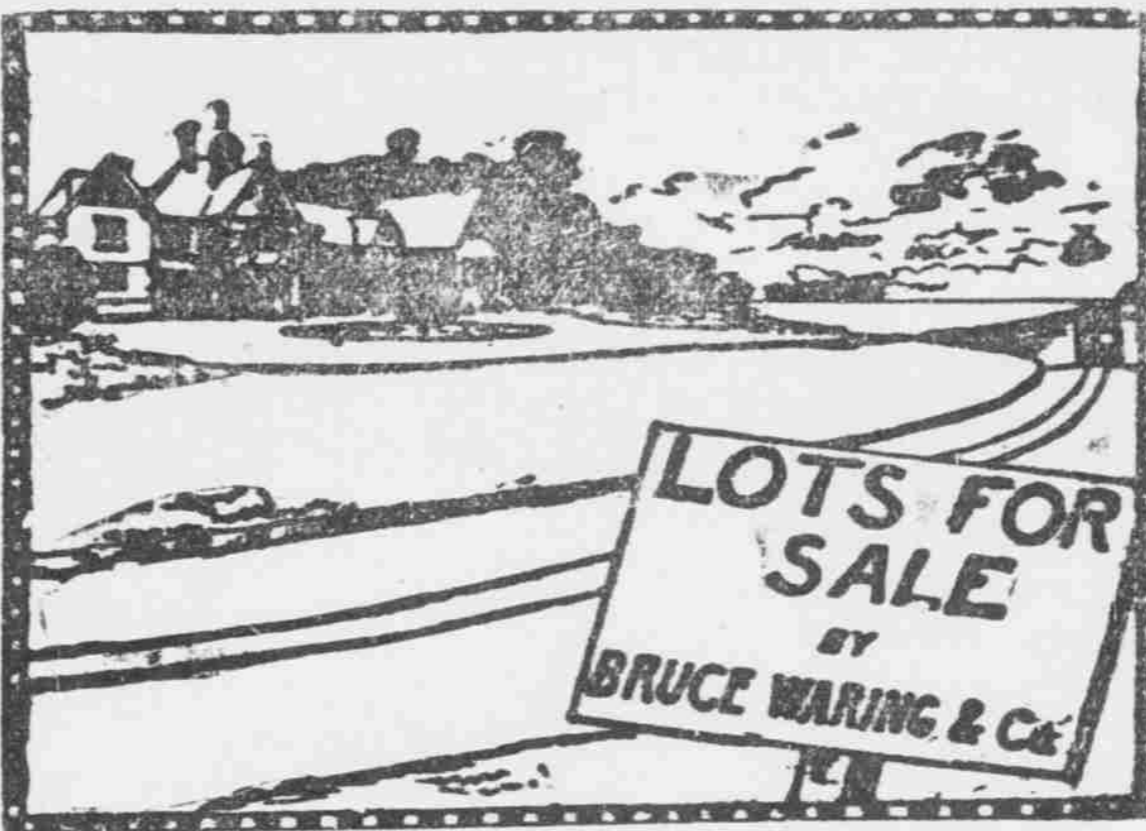
