An Italian decree has been gazetted suspending the duty on cereals until June 30. During bread riots at Sororina a mob attempted to set fire to the municipal buildings. The troops fired a volley into the crowd, killing two men and wounding several others.

The ship A. J. Fuller took sugar at the Inter-island wharf on Saturday.

The Warrimoo did not get away until about 4:30 o'clock Saturday morning.

There are at present 15 foreign sailing vessels and one man-of-war in port.

The Archer and Western Monarch were loading sugar at the railroad wharf on Saturday.

A great many people are confidently expecting the Gaelic in from San Francisco tonight.

The schooner Emma and Louisa is loading up preparatory to her trip back to San Diego.

The James Makee which arrived Sunday reports the Noeua at Kahliliwal unloading freight. She had 330 bags of Kilauea sugar on Saturday.

Inspector Short has returned from his fortnight's vacation and is now on the night watch. Inspector Storey is now taking his turn at rest and recreation.

The Zealandia brought 1,300 tons of freight. This is her largest cargo on the run this time. The amount is more than the Australia had brought for several trips.

Butcher Hindal is with the Zealandia after making three trips to the north with the Australia. He says the Klondike route is the worst he ever traveled and that Skaguay is the most miserable hole of a town on earth, with Dyea reported the same.

The W. G. Hall arrived from Kaula, Sunday morning. The purser reports as follows: "Stmr. Kauai at Waimea. Had 3,000 bags of sugar at 4:45 p. m. Fine weather on Kaula. There were 135 bales of wool stored at Hanapapa warehouse on Niihau. Sugar left on Kaula was as follows: K. S. M., 4,200; V. R., 1,800; Makaweli, 6,500; G. & R., 1,500; K. P., 600; M. S. Co., 8,000. Total of 24,600 bags.

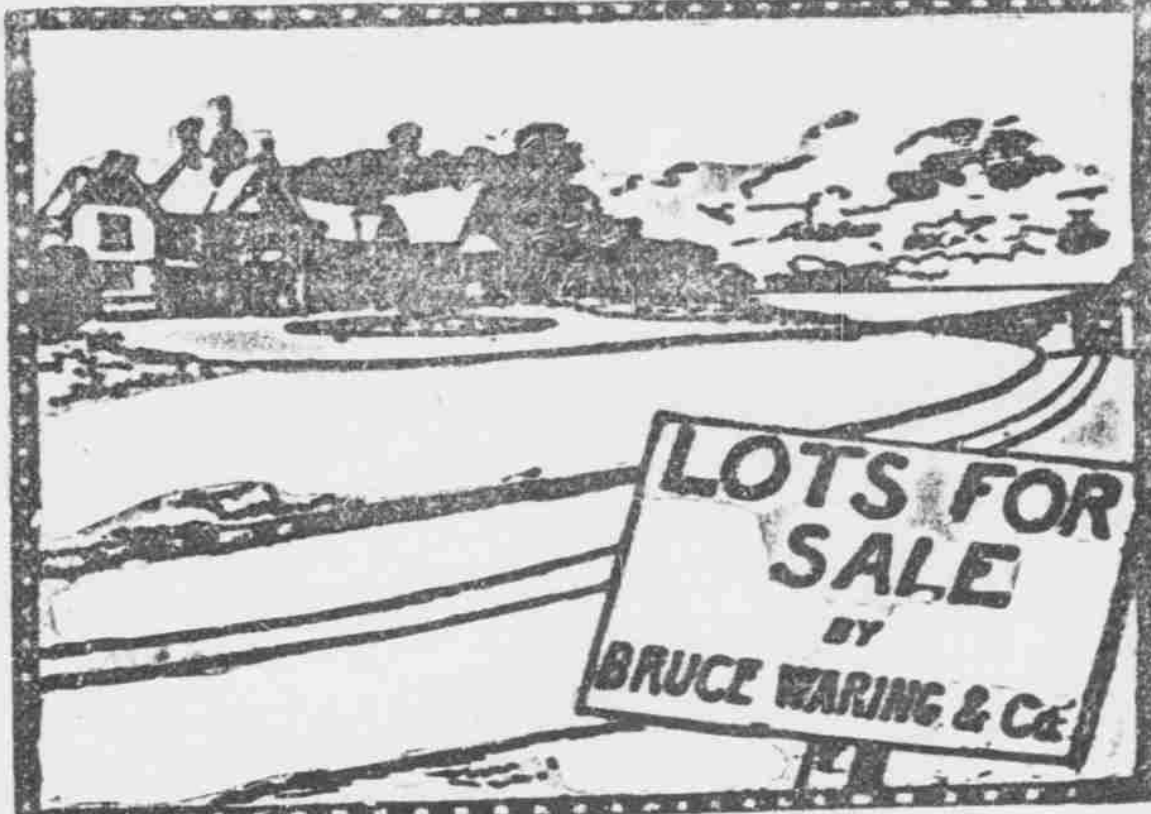
